7. PROCEDURAL MOTION - RESOLUTION TO LIMIT DEBATE ON THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 4 OF 2018)

Motion Made and Question Proposed -

THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), and the Resolution of the House of Wednesday, February 14, 2018 on limitation of time on a Bill sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order, this House <u>further resolves</u> that debate on the business appearing as Order Number 8 being the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 4 of 2018) shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) Minutes for each Member speaking.
