The Joint Parliamentary Select Committee on the Election of Members to the East African Legislative Assembly (EALA) was established on 13<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 by the National Assembly and the Senate respectively.

### **Mandate of the Committee**

The Committee was mandated to –

1. suggest appropriate timelines for purposes of notifications, nominations and elections of EALA Members;
2. consider the nominees, oversee the election process and report to the respective Houses of Parliament within the timelines stipulated in the Elections Rules; and
3. undertake any other functions as contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 within the stipulated timelines.

## CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

**Hon. Speaker,**

The East African Legislative Assembly (EALA) is the independent legislative arm of the East African Community (EAC), established under Article 9 of the EAC Treaty. EALA membership comprise of nine (9) members elected by each Partner State. Article 50 of the Treaty requires that EALA Members represent as much as practicable the various political parties represented in the National Parliament, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in the partner states.

The Assembly plays a critical role in the furtherance of the EAC objectives by:

1. liaising with National Assemblies of partner states on matters relating to the community;
2. debating and approving the budget of the Community;
3. considering of annual reports on the activities of the community, annual audit reports and any other reports referred to it; and
4. discussing all matters referred to it regarding the community and making recommendations as it may deem necessary for the implementation of the community treaty.

**Hon. Speaker,**

The Fourth Assembly of the East African Legislative Assembly which commenced on 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2017 will come to an end on 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. Consequently, the member states are expected to elect members of the Assembly **within ninety days** before the end of the term of the ongoing Assembly. The Parliament of Kenya is therefore expected to elect its representatives to the Assembly between **18<sup>th</sup> September, 2022** and **16<sup>th</sup> December, 2022** in order to be within the stipulated timelines.

**Hon. Speaker,**

In this regard, the National Assembly and the Senate respectively resolved to establish a Joint Parliamentary Select Committee on Election of Members to the East African Legislative Assembly.

**Hon. Speaker,**

The Joint Select Committee was established on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, by the National Assembly and the Senate respectively to undertake the functions contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.

**Hon. Speaker,**

The Joint Select Committee held its first meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 where the timelines and immediate road map were developed with a view to expediting the election of Members to EALA.

**Hon. Speaker,**

Pursuant to Rule 4 (a) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the Presiding Officers (the Clerks of the Houses of Parliament) notified the public via a *Gazette* Notice No. 13031, dated 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 and placed an advertisement in the *Standard* and *Daily Nation* newspapers of 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 inviting interested and qualified persons to apply within a period of seven days from the date of the notice.

**Hon. Speaker,**

At the close of application period on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022 at 5:00 p.m., a total of three hundred and forty-eight (348) applications had been received through the Offices of the Clerk of the National Assembly and the Senate and through the official email address.

The Presiding Officers noted that, although the total number of applications received was 348, a number of applicants submitted multiple applications, with some applicants submitting up to four applications at the offices of the Clerks and on email. After reconciliation of the applications, the total number of applicants was 287.

On Monday, 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, pursuant to Rule 7 of the Rules, the Presiding Officers made a pre-nomination briefing to the party leadership of both Houses of Parliament before the actual nomination exercise which was carried out on Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022.

**Hon. Speaker,**

On Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Presiding Officers received nomination documents from candidates of political parties and candidates independent of political parties. A total of sixty-nine (69) candidates appeared before the Presiding Officers, out of whom the *Kenya Kwanza* Alliance Coalition presented fifteen (15), the *Azimio la Umoja*-One Alliance Coalition twelve (12) nominees while forty-two (42) were candidates independent of political parties.

Thereafter, **Hon Speaker**, pursuant to rule 12 of the Rules, the Presiding Officers gave the public an opportunity to inspect the nomination papers and lodge any complaints they may have had with respect to a candidate's nomination. The inspection was done on Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 from 9:00am to 4:00pm.

Consequently, **at the close of the nominations on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022**, the Presiding Officers forwarded the names and nomination papers of all duly nominated candidates to the Joint Select Committee for consideration, and complaints lodged during the inspection days.

**Hon. Speaker,**

The Joint Select Committee observed that observed that the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 assigns crucial roles in the election process, to the Presiding Officers instead of the Joint Select Committee.

**Hon. Speaker,**

The Committee further observed that some of the candidates did not comply with the advertisements in the Daily Nation and the Standard newspapers and the Kenya Gazette on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022. Most of the applicants did not comply with provisions of the Elections Act as regards qualifications of Member of Parliament, either through a political party or as an independent candidate.

The Committee also observed that the provisions on withdrawal of candidature is restrictive to those who may wish to withdraw before election day.

**Hon. Speaker,**

Based on the aforementioned observations, the Joint Select Committee therefore recommends enhancements to the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 to –

1. enhance the role of the Joint Select Committee;
2. make provisions on withdrawal of candidature to allow candidates to withdraw at any time before the election day as they may wish;
3. provide a framework for formal campaigns.

## CHAPTER ONE

### 1. INTRODUCTION

1. The East African Legislative Assembly (EALA) is established under Article 9 of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (EAC) as one of the key organs and independent institutions of the Community. EALA's membership comprises nine (9) members elected by each Partner State.
2. Articles 50 and 51 of the EAC Treaty provide for election of Members of the Assembly and the tenure of office of elected Members, respectively. Specifically, Article 51(1) provides that an elected member of the Assembly shall hold office for five years and is eligible for re-election for a further term of five years.
3. By letters dated 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2022 and 21<sup>st</sup> June, 2022, the Clerk of EALA transmitted a notification to all Member States informing them that the term of the Fourth Assembly, which commenced on 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2017, would come to an end on 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. The letters further notified Member States that they were to elect members of the Assembly within ninety days before the end of the term of the ongoing Assembly (*Annex 1*).
4. Consequently, the Parliament of Kenya was required to elect its representatives to the Assembly between 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2022 and 16<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 in order to be within the stipulated timelines.
5. By a Motion adopted by the National Assembly and the Senate on 13<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, respectively, the Joint Parliamentary Select Committee on the Election of the Members of EALA, consisting of seven (7) Members from each of the Houses of Parliament, was established (*Annex 2*).

8. The Joint Select Committee was mandated to undertake the functions contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 (*Annex 3*). The Committee was further mandated to-

- a. suggest appropriate timelines for purposes of notifications, nominations and elections of EALA Members;
- b. consider the nominees, oversee the election process and report to the respective Houses within the timelines stipulated in the Elections Rules; and
- c. undertake any other functions as contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 within the stipulated timelines.



### 1.1. Election of Members to the East African Legislative Assembly

9. The Election of Members to the East African Legislative Assembly is guided by the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 (*Annex 4*).
10. Articles 50 and 51 of the Treaty provide for the election of Members of the Assembly and the tenure of office of elected Members, respectively. Specifically, Article 51(1) provides that an elected member of the Assembly shall hold office for five years and is eligible for re-election for a further term of five years.
11. Further, the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 provides for the election of Members to the Assembly. Section 4(1) of the Act provides that the election of Members to the Assembly shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure of the Legislatures of the Partner States, while section 4(2) requires that Member States shall each elect nine members to the Assembly. The election should be held within ninety (90) days before the expiry of the date of the outgoing Assembly.
12. In order to comply with section 4 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 on the rules of procedure, the Parliament of Kenya is guided by the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 which detail the processes and timelines leading to election of members to the East African Assembly.
13. Rule 3 provides that a person shall not qualify to vie for election unless he or she meets the requirements for election set out under Article 50(2) of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 22 of the Elections Act, 2011.

14. Article 50 of the Treaty provides as follows –

- (1) The National Assembly of each Partner State shall elect, not from among its members, nine members of the Assembly, who shall represent as much as it is feasible, the various political parties represented in the National assembly, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in that Partner State, in accordance with such procedure as the National Assembly of each Partner State may determine.*
- (2) A person shall be qualified to be elected a Member of the Assembly by the National Assembly of a Partner State in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if such person –*
  - (a) is a citizen of that Partner State;*
  - (b) is qualified to be elected a member of the National Assembly of that Partner State under its Constitution;*
  - (c) is not holding office as a Minister in that Partner State;*
  - (d) is not an officer in the service of the Community; and*
  - (e) has proven experience or interest in consolidating and furthering the aims and objectives of the Community.*

15. Article 99 of the Constitution sets out the qualifications and disqualifications for election as a Member of Parliament as follows –

- (1) Unless disqualified under subsection (2), a person qualifies for nomination as a member of Parliament if the person –*
  - (a) is registered as a voter;*
  - (b) satisfies any educational, moral and ethical requirements prescribed by the Constitution and this Act; and*
  - (c) is nominated by a political party, or is an independent candidate who is supported –*
    - (i) in the case of election to the National Assembly, by at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency; or*
    - (ii) in the case of election to the Senate, by at least two thousand registered voters in the county.*

*(2) A person is disqualified from being elected a member of Parliament if the person –*

- (a) is a State officer or other public officer, other than a Member of Parliament;*
  - (b) has, at any time within the five years immediately preceding the date of election, held office as a member of the Commission;*
  - (c) has not been a citizen of Kenya for at least the ten years immediately preceding the date of election;*
  - (d) is a member of a county assembly;*
  - (e) is of unsound mind;*
  - (f) is an undischarged bankrupt;*
  - (g) is subject to a sentence of imprisonment of at least six months, as at the date of registration as a candidate, or at the date of election; or*
  - (h) is found, in accordance with any law, to have misused or abused a State office or public office or in any way to have contravened Chapter Six of the Constitution.*
- (3) A person is not disqualified under subsection (2) unless all possibility of appeal or review of the relevant sentence or decision has been exhausted.*

16. Further, section 22 of the Elections Act, 2011 provides for the qualifications for nomination of candidates as follows –

- (1) A person may be nominated as a candidate for an election under this Act only if that person –*
- a. is qualified to be elected to that office under the Constitution and this Act; and*
  - b. holds –*
    - i. in the case of a Member of Parliament, a degree from a university recognized in Kenya; or*

*ii. in the case of member of a county assembly, a degree from a university recognized in Kenya.*

*(1A) Notwithstanding subsection (1), this section shall come into force and shall apply to qualifications for candidates in the general elections to be held after the 2017 general elections.*

*(1B) The provisions of this section apply to qualifications to nomination for a party list member under section 34.*

*(3) Notwithstanding subsection (1)(b), a person may be nominated as a candidate for election as President, Deputy President, county Governor or deputy county Governor only if the person is a holder of a degree from a university recognized in Kenya.*

17. The Joint Select Committee however noted that section 22(1)(b)(i) was the subject matter of Constitutional Petition No. 28 of 2021, where on 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2022, the court held that the section was unconstitutional and in violation of Articles 24, 27, 38(3) and 56 of the Constitution. The qualification for a Member of Parliament to possess a degree was therefore nullified.

18. Section 24 of the Elections Act, 2011 is also a key consideration in this process with regard to candidates independent of political parties. Section 24(1)(c) provides that a person qualifies for nomination as a member of Parliament if the person is nominated by a political party, or is an independent candidate who is supported in the case of election to the National Assembly, by at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency or in the case of election to the Senate, by at least two thousand registered voters in the county.



## 1.2. Meetings of the Joint Select Committee on Election of Members to EALA

19. The Joint Select Committee held its first sitting on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 and considered and approved the timelines for the election of Members to EALA as follows –

20. The Joint Select Committee further considered the issue of the entitlement for nomination slots under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.

21. Rule 6(1) provides as follows –

*“The number of candidates that each party shall be entitled to nominate for election under these Rules shall be three times the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of elected Members of that party by such number as the Joint Select Committee shall determine and dividing the result by the total number of elected Members of Parliament”.*

22. Rule 9 of the Rules provides that-

*“a person intending to vie for election independent of a political party shall submit his or her duly filled nomination form in the format prescribed in the Second Schedule to a presiding officer in the manner specified in the notice published under rule 4 and in accordance with rule 10”.*

23. In this regard, the Joint Select Committee summed up the total number of members in each political party in both Houses as a proportion of the total membership of Parliament, which is 411 Members, being the total number of members currently in Parliament and multiplied by the resultant figure by 9.

24. The Joint Select Committee having considered the relative strengths of the coalitions in Parliament resolved that the *Kenya Kwanza* Alliance Coalition, being the Majority Coalition, nominates fifteen (15) nominees and the *Azimio la Umoja*–One Kenya Alliance Coalition, being the Minority Coalition, nominates twelve (12) nominees in order to ensure adequate representation of political parties in the membership of EALA.

25. The Joint Select Committee was also conscious of the fact that twelve (12) independent members in Parliament are indeed independent of one another and therefore could not be construed to be a “political party” for purposes of computing the proportional entitlements for parties. The Committee however resolved that independent candidates be invited to submit their nomination forms in accordance with rule 9 of the Rules.

### 1.3. Invitation for Applications for Election to EALA

26. Pursuant to rule 4 of the EALA Election Rules, the Clerks of the Houses of Parliament, being the Presiding Officers for EALA Elections placed adverts in the *Gazette* and in the *Standard* and *Daily Nation* newspapers on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 calling for applications from interested and qualified persons (*Annex 5*).

27. The notice invited candidates from political parties to present their applications on or before 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 and independent candidates to present their applications on the nomination day set for 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022.

28. At the close of the application period, the Presiding Officers received a total of 348 applications. A summary of the applications is indicated in the following table-

29. The Presiding Officers noted that, although the total number of applications received was 348, a number of applicants submitted multiple applications, with some applicants submitting up to four applications at the offices of the Clerks and on email. After reconciliation of the applications, the total number of applicants was 287.

30. It was also noted that that one of the applicants, Ms. Susan Cherotich Maritim, Serial No. NA/148, who had sought nomination under the Kenya Kwanza Alliance Coalition, subsequently withdrew her application through a letter dated 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 and received in the Office of the Clerk of the National Assembly on 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 (*Annex 6*).

31. The applications received may be further categorized as follows-

32. Further, Ms. Valentine Chepkemai Mutai, Serial No. EM/059, who sought nomination under the United Democratic Movement Party (UDM), has been placed under both the *Kenya Kwanza* Alliance Coalition and the *Azimio la Umoja* One Kenya Coalition as UDM is accounted for under the *Kenya Kwanza* Alliance Coalition in the National Assembly and under the *Azimio la Umoja* One Kenya Coalition in the Senate.

#### 1.4. Pre-Nomination Briefing

33. By a letter dated 3rd November, 2022, the Clerks of both Houses, invited the Majority and Minority Party Leaders of both Houses for a pre-nomination briefing which was held on Monday, 7th November, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. (Annex 7). The party leaders were requested to submit their nominees for election to the Presiding Officers on nomination day which was set for Wednesday, 9th November, 2022. Independent candidates were similarly to submit their applications to the Presiding Officers on the nomination day.
34. Pursuant to Rule 7 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the Presiding Officers forwarded the schedule of applicants to the leaders of Majority and Minority Parties in both Houses of Parliament for their action (*Annex 8*).
35. The purpose of the pre-nomination briefing was to brief the Political Party leadership on the nomination requirements under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, the East African Legislative Assembly Act, 2011 and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.
36. The Presiding Officers requested the political parties to undertake the nomination process in accordance with rule 6 and 8 of the Rules and submit the nomination papers of their nominees on the appointed Nomination Day.
37. The Majority and Minority Party Leaders were further requested to note that on the nomination day, which was scheduled to be Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the following documents would be required for inspection by the Presiding Officers in respect of each candidate nominated for election to EALA:

- (1) A duly filled Nomination of Party Nominee Form for Election of a Member of the East African Legislative Assembly as set out in the First Schedule to the Rules;*
- (2) A letter certifying that rule 8(3) requiring that each party nominates candidates through a transparent and democratic process has been complied with and attaching the final list of nominees of the party.*
- (3) A copy of the National Identity Card or Passport of the nominee evidencing that the person is and has been a citizen of Kenya for at least ten years immediately preceding the date of the election (Article 50(2) of the Treaty and Article 99(2)(c) of the Constitution);*
- (4) Detailed Curriculum Vitae (as required in the form set out in the First Schedule to the Rules);*
- (5) Certified copies of certificates and testimonials (as required in the form set out in the First Schedule to the Rules);*
- (6) For nominees who are State officers, public officers, sitting members of Parliament or are officers in the service of the East African Community, evidence of resignation as received by their employer or competent authority (Article 50(1) of the Treaty and Article 99(2)(a) and (d) of the Constitution);*
- (7) For nominees who have held office as members of the IEBC, evidence that they have not held such office within five years immediately preceding the date of election; and*
- (8) An Affidavit sworn by the candidate in support of the candidate's nomination.*



## CHAPTER TWO

### 2. NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

38. On 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Presiding Officers received nomination papers of independent candidates and candidates nominated by the Majority Party Coalition and Minority Party coalition. The nomination centre was opened from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm in accordance with Rule 10.

39. A total of sixty-nine (69) candidates appeared before the Presiding Officers, out of whom the *Kenya Kwanza* Alliance Coalition presented fifteen (15) nominees, the *Azimio la Umoja*-One Kenya Alliance Coalition twelve (12) nominees while forty-two (42) persons were candidates independent of political parties.

40. Upon scrutiny of the nomination papers to determine if the requirements for election as a Member of the EALA had been met by the applicants, the Presiding Officers cleared and issued provisional nomination certificates to twenty-eight (28) candidates. Out of this number, twenty-seven (27) nominees were affiliated to the political parties while one (1) was independent of a political party.

41. The list of provisionally nominated candidates which was transmitted to the Joint Select Committee on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, is shown in table below-

42. The Presiding Officers received-(*Annex 9a*)

- a. a letter from Mr. Yasser Ali Sheikh submitted on 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 requesting the inclusion of the name "Bajaber" in the certificate of nomination to EALA and on the ballot paper; and
- b. an affidavit from Mr. Mwangi Godffrey Maina requesting inclusion of the name "Karobia" on the ballot paper.

43. The Presiding Officers further received the following letters (*Annex 9b*)-

- a. Mr. Isaac Salat Ntiyieine submitted a letter received by the Clerk of the National Assembly on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at 9:00 pm indicating that he had inadvertently not indicated his political party, being United Democratic Alliance (UDA), in the application and requesting for onward transmission of his application to the Leader of the Majority Party for consideration.
  - b. Ms. Elizabeth Akinyi Obala submitted a letter dated 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 indicating that she had inadvertently not indicated her political party, being Orange Democratic Movement (ODM), in the application.
44. The following forty-two (42) applicants sought to be nominated independent of political parties pursuant to Rule 9 but were disqualified for the reasons highlighted in the table below:

45. To authenticate the eligibility of the provisionally nominated candidates, the Presiding Officers wrote the following letters to –

(a) the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) (*Annex 10a*) to confirm-

- i. *whether or not, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, each provisionally nominated candidates is registered as a voter in the voters Register held by the Commission; and*
- ii. *whether or not, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the list submitted by the independent candidates, as persons supporting their nominations, are registered voters in the respective constituencies (at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency) or counties (at least two thousand registered voters in the county);*

(b) the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) (*Annex 10b*), to ascertain whether the independent candidates meet the conditions set out in section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011 which provides inter alia that – a person qualifies to be nominated as an independent candidate for presidential, parliamentary and county elections for the purposes of Articles 97, 98, 137, 177 and 180 of the Constitution if that person has not been a member of any political party for at least three months preceding the date of the election

46. On 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the IEBC through a letter, *Ref IEBC/VREO/11/10/1*, dated 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, (*Annex 11a*) indicated the status of political party affiliation for the provisionally nominated candidates by political parties. The letter confirmed that all the twenty-eight (28) provisionally nominated candidates were duly registered as voters as required under the law, as shown herein below-

47. Accordingly, only Mr. Duncan Mwangi Ndegwa was not affiliated to a political party and was thus eligible to be nominated as an independent candidate, pending verification by the IEBC to ascertain whether the list of supporters attached to his nomination met the threshold of Article 99 of the Constitution. The letter from the Registrar of Political Parties is attached as *Annex 11b*.

48. On 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Presiding Officer received a letter, *Ref No: IEBC/VREO/11/10/1* dated 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, from IEBC in response to a request by the Clerks of both Houses of Parliament requesting the Commission to confirm whether or not as required under Article 99 (1) (c) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the lists submitted by the Independent Candidate, Mr. Duncan Mwangi Ndegwa of ID No. 7039426, as persons supporting his nomination are registered as voters in Limuru Constituency (*Annex 11c*).

49. In the letter, the Commission advised that the Candidate had not met the requisite threshold as provided for in Article 99 of the Constitution. The Commission indicated that upon scrutiny of the records-

- a. the list submitted by the nominee contained 2003 recorded supporters;
- b. 906 of the supporters attached copies of their National Identity cards while 1097 did not attach the same;
- c. through the verification process of the records, the Commission confirms that the nominee has been supported by 924 registered voters out of which only 337 belong to Limuru Constituency.

#### **2.1. Inspection of Nomination Papers**

50. In keeping with Rule 12, the Presiding Officers opened the designated nomination centre for two working days, Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 and Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 for any interested member of the public to inspect the nomination papers and file complaints, if any.

51. At the close of the two days appointed for inspection of nomination papers, the Presiding Officers received complaints from the following persons- (*Annex 12*)

- a. Hon. Chirau Ali Mwakwere through his Advocates, M/S Gikera Vadgama submitted a letter on 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, alleging that –
  - i. The *Azimio* Coalition had received a list of all applicants from the Clerks of the National Assembly and the Senate for distribution to affiliate parties. The list was not delivered to Wiper Headquarters.
  - ii. Fake minutes from Wiper Headquarters dated 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022, a date before the deadline of 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 of submission of applications for EALA, were used to confirm that three names were purportedly deliberated and approved by the Wiper Management Committee meeting of 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022.
  - iii. Candidate, Hellen Mueni Ndeti's application to the Clerks of both the National Assembly and the Senate is dated 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022

yet the advert for EALA applications was issued on the 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2022.

b. Mr. Abdulaziz Gakuria submitted a letter on 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 alleging that-

i. Ms. Hellen Mueni Ndeti purports to have made an application for her EALA nomination in a letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 yet the first advert appeared on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022.

ii. Ms. Winfred S. Mutua made her application on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022 but indications are that it was received a day after the meeting of the WDM National Management Committee.

iii. The WDM National Management Committee met on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022 to make a decision yet the deadline for applications was 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022. This locked out and disenfranchised any applicants who may have applied to the Clerks of the Senate and the National Assembly directly.

iv. He doubts the authenticity of the minutes provided by WDM.

c. Mr. Fredrick Kioko Musau submitted a letter on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 stating that he is aggrieved by his Party's decision – Wiper Democratic Movement to leave out his name from the final shortlist through a process that was not transparent and inclusive.

He further requested for the official list of all the EALA nomination applicants who submitted their documents and a certified copy of the minutes presented by WDM Kenya which contained the instructions of the final list proposed for nomination. He intends to appeal to the Dispute Tribunal.

d. Mr. Matthew Malusi submitted a letter on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 alleging that –

i. The Wiper Movement from Nairobi branch has been left out of the nomination process despite presenting a candidate.

ii. Wiper has nominated persons who are members of county assemblies;

### CHAPTER THREE

#### 3. CONSIDERATION OF NOMINEES BY THE COMMITTEE

52. At its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Joint Select Committee considered the nominees submitted by the Majority, Minority and the independent candidates as well as complaints submitted during the inspection of the nominees.

##### 3.1. Consideration of Complaints

53. Complaint by Hon. Chirau Ali Mwakwere, the Joint Select Committee observed *that*:

- a. The party dispute regarding non-transmission of a list of all applicants by *Azimio la Umoja* One Kenya Alliance to Wiper Democratic Movement Party ought to be referred to the relevant dispute resolution tribunal or internal coalition dispute resolution mechanisms as contained in the coalition agreement. The Joint Select Committee can neither be able to intermeddle in coalition affairs nor convert itself into a quasi-judicial organ to make a determination on this matter;
  - i. On the allegation that the minutes from Wiper Democratic Movement Party Headquarters were not authentic, the Committee observed that the matter ought to be adjudicated by the relevant party organs;
  - ii. On the allegation that some applications were received outside the specified application window the committee observed that -
    - a. procedures for commencing applications are governed by Rule 4 and 5 of the EALA (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017;
    - b. pursuant to the Rule 4 the Clerks of the two Houses of Parliament placed the advertisements in the Newspapers and *Kenya Gazette* on 26<sup>th</sup> October requiring receipt of applications by 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022; and

- c. the application of Ms. Helen Mueni Ndeti was received by the Clerk of the National Assembly, within the prescribed period as per the advertisement, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 and assigned serial number NA/152.

*54. On the complaint by Mr. Abdulaziz Gakuria*

- i. On the allegation that some applications were received outside the specified application window, the Joint Select Committee observed-
  - a. procedures for commencing applications are governed by the EALA (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017. Pursuant to Rule 4, the Presiding Officers are required to notify and invite members of the public to apply within seven days from the date of notice, for nomination to be elected as a member of the East African Legislative Assembly;
  - b. consequently, the Clerks of the two Houses of Parliament placed the advertisements in the Newspapers and *Kenya Gazette* on 26<sup>th</sup> October requiring receipt of applications by 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022;
- ii. on allegation that Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua made her application on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022, but indications are that it was received on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November a day after the meeting of the WDM National Management Committee, the Joint Select Committee observed that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution.
- iii. On allegation that WDM National Management Committee met on 1<sup>st</sup> November to make decision, yet the deadline for applications was 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 locking out and disenfranchising some applicants, the Joint Select Committee observed that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution.



- iv. On the allegation that the Minutes from Wiper Democratic Movement Party Headquarters were not authentic, the Joint Select Committee observed that, neither the Presiding Officers nor the Joint Select Committee are privy to the party's deliberations. Further, the names of the nominees of the Wiper Democratic Party and the Minutes were submitted by the Leader of the Minority Party representing the *Azimio la Umoja* One Kenya Coalition as contemplated in Rule 10.
- v. On the request, to the Presiding Officers to furnish names that have undergone proper party vetting, the Joint Select Committee observed that, pursuant to Rule 7, the Presiding Officers wrote a letter (*Annex 7*) to Majority and Minority Party leaders requesting them to submit the name of their respective nominees for election on nomination day which was set for Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022. Consequently, the question as to proper party vetting of the nominees before submission to the Presiding Officers, rests with the political parties.

55. *Complaint by Mr. Fredrick Kioko Musau that-*

- i. he was aggrieved by the decision by WDM-K to leave out his name from the final shortlist through a process that was not transparent and inclusive. The Joint Select Committee observed that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution.
- ii. he further be furnished with the list of all applicants for nomination and election to the membership of EALA and a certified copy of the minutes presented by the WDM-K. The Joint Select Committee observed that the complainant is entitled, under Article 35 of the Constitution to access any information that is in

custody of Parliament and the said information was availed to the complainant.

*56. Complaint by Mr. Matthew Malusi that-*

- i.* the WDM-K from Nairobi Branch has been left out of the nomination process, the Joint Select Committee observed that, that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution;
- ii.* the WDM-K has nominated persons who are members of county assemblies, the Joint Select Committee observed that, the Ms. Hellen Mueni Ndeti of ID No. 3933371 submitted a resignation letter dated 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, addressed to the Speaker of the Machakos County Assembly and received by the Machakos County Assembly (*Annex 13*) and that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution;
- iii.* Ms. Hellen Mueni Ndeti made an application for her EALA nomination in a letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, yet the first advert appeared on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, the Joint Select Committee observed that-
  - a.* procedures for commencing applications are governed by Rule 4 and 5 of the EALA (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017;
  - b.* pursuant to the Rule 4 the Clerks of the two Houses of Parliament placed the advertisements in the Newspapers and Kenya Gazette on 26<sup>th</sup> October requiring receipt of applications by 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022;
  - c.* the application of Ms. Helen Mueni Ndeti was received by the Clerk of the National Assembly, within the prescribed period as per the advertisement, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 and assigned serial number NA/152.

### 3.2. Consideration of letters from applicants

57. On the request by Mr. Yasser Ali Sheikh to include his popular name 'Bajaber' in the provisional nomination certificate and ballot paper, the Joint Select Committee observed that the, provisional nomination certificate granted to the applicant indicated his official names as contained in his National Identity Card. The nominee had not presented any evidence of change of name under the Registration of Persons Act, Cap 107 and the Rules thereunder hence indication of a name different from that contained in the National Identity Card whether in the provisional certificate of nomination or the ballot paper would be irregular.
58. On the affidavit sworn by Mr. Mwangi Godffrey Maina seeking to incorporate his popular name in the Ballot Paper, the Joint Select Committee observed that, the provisional nomination certificate granted to the applicant indicated his official names as contained in his National Identity Card. The nominee had not presented any evidence of change of name under the Registration of Persons Act, Cap 107 and the Rules thereunder hence indication of a name different from that contained in the National Identify Card whether in the provisional certificate of nomination or the ballot paper would be irregular.
59. On an application by Mr. Isaac Salat Ntiyieine indicating that he had inadvertently not indicated his political party, being United Democratic Alliance (UDA), in the application and requesting for onward transmission of his application to the Leader of the Majority Party for consideration. The Joint Select Committee observed that the request was received after the deadline of submission of applications and therefore could not be processed further.

60. On an application by Ms. Elizabeth Akinyi Obala indicating that she had inadvertently not indicated her political party, being Orange Democratic Movement (ODM), in the application, the Joint Select Committee observed that the request was received after the deadline of submission of applications and therefore could not be processed further.

## CHAPTER FOUR

### 4. OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

61. Having analyzed the applications and the Presiding Officers reports and other submissions, the committee makes the following observations-

- (a) **Mandate of the Joint Select Committee** - The Joint Select Committee noted that the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 does not assign the Joint Select Committee a prominent role in the electoral process;
- (b) **Advertisement calling for Applications** – Despite the advertisement by the Presiding Officers carried in the daily newspapers and the Kenya *Gazette* on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, the Joint Select Committee noted that, majority of the candidates seem not to have referred to the requisite provisions of the constitutional and statutory requirements with respect to qualifications;
- (c) **Withdrawal of a Candidate** - Rule 11(1) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 states that withdrawal of candidates shall not be accepted after four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day. This provision is restrictive to candidates who may wish to withdraw before the election day.
- (d) **Campaigns by Nominees** - Rule 14 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 provides for campaigns by nominees, who may approach and seek the support of Members of Parliament. However, candidates who are not former Members of Parliament or familiar with the precincts of Parliament may have difficulties accessing and seeking the support of the Members of Parliament for purposes of campaigns;

62. Based on the foregoing, the Committee therefore makes the following recommendations-

- (i) Amendment of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 to enhance the role of the Joint Select Committee in whole process commencing with the invitation of applications to the submission of names to the East African Legislative Assembly.
- (ii) Amendment of the following Rules of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017-
  - i. Rule 11 on the withdrawal of candidature be amended to allow candidates to withdraw at any time before the election day; and
  - ii. Rule 14 on the campaigns by nominees be amended to include a framework for campaigns to ensure all nominees, whether they are former members of Parliament or not, have equal opportunity to campaign.
- (iii) That, having met all the requirements as provided for under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, the Constitution of Kenya, the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011, the Elections Act, 2011 and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the following nominees qualify for election as members of the East African Legislative Assembly –





The application window closed on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022. As at 5.00pm on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022, 348 applications had been received through the following mediums;

The secretariat was in the process of sorting out the applications per party, as well as reconciling double applications received from same applicants through multiple channels. The Committee having noted the advert on the dailies had not indicated the closing time of the applications, directed that all applications be tallied up to those received at midnight of the 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022.

  - a. Party Leaders will present their candidates to the presiding officers in accordance with Rules 8(1) and 10;
  - b. independent candidates will also present their nomination forms pursuant to Rules 4, 9 and 10.
4. Transmission of nomination papers to Joint Committee – pursuant to Rule 13, the Presiding Officers will forward the names and nomination papers of duly nominated candidates to the Joint Select Committee on Elections of Members of EALA for consideration.
5. Consideration by the Houses - the Joint Committee will submit to both Houses its Report on consideration of nominees for consideration pursuant to Rule 13(5). If adopted, the Presiding Officers will Gazette election date.
6. Campaigns - candidates cleared for elections may carry out campaigns in accordance with Rule 14.
7. Notification of election date – pursuant to Rule 15, the Presiding Officers will notify the date of elections in the Kenya Gazette and two (2) newspapers of nationwide circulation. The Presiding Officers will also prepare ballot papers in accordance with Rule 16.
8. Elections – elections will be conducted by secret ballot in each House pursuant to Rules 17, 18 and 19. The Joint Committee approved Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> November 2022 as the election date.
9. Publication and transmission of names of elected members – the Presiding Officers will gazette duly elected Members and transmit the same to the Clerk of EALA pursuant to Rule 20.

The secretariat submitted the proposed formula for allocation of party entitlements based on the rules and equitable party numbers in both houses as follows;

$$X = \{(A/416)9\}3$$

Where x is number of persons to be nominated by a political party

A is number of elected members of a political party.

From the foregoing, the calculations were as follows;



**BRIEFING ON THE PRENOMINATION STATUS**

The secretariat took Members through what transpired during the Pre- nomination briefing of Party leadership as follows;

That, the Presiding Officers submitted to the party leadership as follows;

1. By a letter, Ref. EALA/GEN/10, dated 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2022, the Clerk of the East African Legislative Assembly (EALA) informed the Speakers of the Parliaments of the Partner States in the East African Community of the impending expiry of the term of the current Assembly, which shall end on 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2022.
2. Subsequently, the National Assembly and the Senate, on 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 and 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, respectively, passed resolutions establishing a Joint Select Committee on the Election of Members to EALA. The Committee is responsible for coordinating the process that will culminate in the election of nine Members that will represent Kenya in EALA.
3. The Joint Committee held its first meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> October 2022 and approved timelines to guide the process and further approved the publication of advertisements in the Kenya *Gazette* and in the newspapers inviting applications from interested qualified persons for election as Members of EALA.
4. Thereafter, on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 the Clerks of both Houses of Parliament, who are also the Presiding Officers in the elections, placed advertisements in the newspapers and in the Kenya *Gazette* calling for applications from interested qualified persons for election as

Members of EALA. The deadline for submission of the applications was 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022.

5. At the close of the application period a total of three hundred and forty-eight applications had been received as follows-

7. Although the total number of applications received was 348, a number of applicants submitted multiple applications, with some applicants submitting up to four applications at the offices of the Clerks and on email. After reconciliation of the applications, the total number of applicants was 287.
8. It is also to be noted that one of the applicants, Serial No. NA/148, who had sought nomination under the Kenya Kwanza Alliance Coalition, subsequently withdrew her application through a letter dated 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 and received in the Office of the Clerk



of the National Assembly on 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2022. Further, applicant Serial No. EM/059, who sought nomination under the United Democratic Movement Party (UDM), has been placed under both the Kenya Kwanza Alliance Coalition and the Azimio la Umoja One Kenya Coalition as UDM is accounted for under the Kenya Kwanza Alliance Coalition in the National Assembly and under the Azimio la Umoja One Kenya Coalition in the Senate.

9. Pursuant to Rule 7 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, by a letter dated 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022, the Clerks of both Houses, invited the Majority and Minority Leaders of both Houses for a pre-nomination briefing. The purpose of the pre-nomination briefing is to brief the leadership of the parties on the nomination requirements under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, the East African Legislative Assembly Act, 2011 and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.
10. Pursuant to Rule 4(b) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, the Presiding Officers appointed Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 as the nomination day. Nomination of candidates shall be held between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at County Hall.
11. Rule 3 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, provides that *“a person shall not qualify to vie for election unless he or she meets the requirements for election set out under Article 50(2) of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 22 of the Elections Act.”*
12. Rule 10 further provides that on the nomination day, an independent candidate or a nominee, the Leader of Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall deliver to the Presiding Officers, the nomination papers of the candidates nominated by the party or the independent candidate, as the case may be.
13. The Leaders of the Majority and the Minority Party must ensure that the nominees are qualified to stand for election in terms of Article 50(2) of the Treaty, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 24 of the Elections Act, 2011.
14. Article 50(2) of the Treaty provides as follows-
  - (1) *The National Assembly of each Partner State shall elect, not from among its members, nine members of the Assembly, who shall represent as much as it is feasible, the various political parties represented in the National Assembly, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in that Partner State, in accordance with such procedure as the National Assembly of each Partner State may determine.*
  - (2) *A person shall be qualified to be elected a Member of the Assembly by the National Assembly of a Partner State in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if such person-*
    - (a) *is a citizen of that Partner State;*
    - (b) *is qualified to be elected a member of the National Assembly of that Partner State under its Constitution;*

- (c) is not holding office as a Minister in that Partner State;*
- (d) is not an officer in the service of the Community; and*
- (e) has proven experience or interest in consolidating and furthering the aims and objectives of the Community.*

15. In terms of Article 50(2)(b) of the Treaty, the qualifications and disqualifications for election as a Member of Parliament are provided for under Article 99 of the Constitution and section 24 of the Elections Act, 2011.

16. Article 99 of the Constitution and section 24 of the Elections Act, 2011 provide similar qualifications and disqualifications for election as a Member of Parliament as follows—

*(1) Unless disqualified under subsection (2), a person qualifies for nomination as a member of Parliament if the person—*

- (a) is registered as a voter;*
- (b) satisfies any educational, moral and ethical requirements prescribed by the Constitution and this Act; and*
- (c) is nominated by a political party, or is an independent candidate who is supported—*
  - (i) in the case of election to the National Assembly, by at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency; or*
  - (ii) in the case of election to the Senate, by at least two thousand registered voters in the county.*

*(2) A person is disqualified from being elected a member of Parliament if the person—*

- (a) is a State officer or other public officer, other than a member of Parliament;*
- (b) has, at any time within the five years immediately preceding the date of election, held office as a member of the Commission;*
- (c) has not been a citizen of Kenya for at least the ten years immediately preceding the date of election;*
- (d) is a member of a county assembly;*
- (e) is of unsound mind;*
- (f) is an undischarged bankrupt;*
- (g) is subject to a sentence of imprisonment of at least six months, as at the date of registration as a candidate, or at the date of election; or*
- (h) is found, in accordance with any law, to have misused or abused a State office or public office or in any way to have contravened Chapter Six of the Constitution.*

*(3) A person is not disqualified under subsection (2) unless all possibility of appeal or review of the relevant sentence or decision has been exhausted.*

17. The attention of nominating political parties is drawn to Article 50(1) of the Treaty and Rule 6(2) which require that in making nominations, each party shall as much as is feasible take into account the need for fair representation of the various political parties in the National Assembly, regional balance, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in Kenya and shall ensure that at least one-third of its nominees are women.

18. In making nominations, political parties should ensure that the one-third gender rule is observed in the nominations in line with Article 50(1) of the Treaty and Rule 6(2) in order to ensure that section 4(4) of the East African Legislative Assembly Act is complied with, on the date of the Elections. Section 4(4) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act provides that "*at least one third of the elected members shall reflect either gender.*"
19. To meet these requirements, particularly the requirement for regional balance and other special interest groups such as persons with disabilities, it may be useful for nominating parties to consult with one another while making their nominations.
20. Rule 6(1) of the Rules provides that-  
*The number of candidates that each party shall be entitled to nominate for election under these Rules shall be three times the figure arrived at by such number as the Joint Committee shall determine and dividing the result by the total number of elected Members of Parliament.*
21. At its meeting held on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022, the Joint Committee, resolved that on nomination day, nominations shall be received from the Coalitions represented in Parliament proportionately as follows-
- (a) The Kenya Kwanza Alliance Coalition shall be entitled to nominate fifteen nominees; and
  - (b) The Azimio la Umoja One Kenya Coalition shall be entitled to nominate twelve nominees.
22. Nominating political parties are required to note that on the nomination day, the following documents need to be availed for inspection by the Presiding Officers in respect of each candidate nominated for election to the East African Legislative Assembly-
- (1) *A duly filled Nomination of Party Nominee Form for Election of a Member of the East African Legislative Assembly;*
  - (2) *A written record (minutes) of the proceedings of the meeting of the party organ at which the final decision to nominate the candidate was made;*
  - (3) *A copy of the National Identity Card or Passport of the candidate;*
  - (4) *Detailed Curriculum Vitae;*
  - (5) *Certified copies of certificates and testimonials;*
  - (6) *An Affidavit sworn by the candidate;*
  - (7) *Candidates who are sitting members of Parliament, will be required to produce evidence of resignation as received by the Speaker before their nomination papers can be accepted on nomination day.*
23. These documents are crucial as they were the documents that will be available for public inspection pursuant to Rule 12 of the Rules on Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022.
24. On the nomination day-
- a. Pursuant to Rule 8, a political party or nominee shall submit the particulars of the nominee in the prescribed form; and
  - b. Pursuant to Rules 9, independent candidates may also present their nomination forms in the prescribed form.




25. Pursuant to Rule 13, at the conclusion of the nomination process, the Presiding Officers will forward the names and nomination papers of duly nominated candidates to the Joint Select Committee on Elections of Members of EALA for consideration.
26. The Joint Committee will submit, to both Houses, its Report on the nominees for consideration pursuant to Rule 13(5). If adopted, the Presiding Officers shall publish the election date in the *Kenya Gazette*.
27. Aspiring candidates may approach and seek the support of a Member of Parliament entitled to vote before the nomination day and may, if nominated, continue to do so after the nomination day pursuant to Rule 14.
28. Pursuant to Rule 15, the Presiding Officers shall publish the election date in the *Kenya Gazette* and in two (2) newspapers of nation-wide circulation.
29. Elections will be conducted by secret ballot in each House pursuant to Rules 17, 18 and 19. The Joint Committee resolved that the election be held on Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> November 2022.
30. Pursuant to Rule 20, within seven days after the declaration of the duly elected members of EALA, the Presiding Officers shall publish in the *Kenya Gazette* the names of the duly elected Members and the Returning Officers shall jointly transmit the same to the Clerk of EALA pursuant to Rule 20.

**CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT REPORT**

Members were taken through the draft report and considered chapters on introduction, nomination of candidates and consideration of nominees by the committee. The Committee made the following interim observations;

- i. The East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 assigns crucial roles in the election process, to the Presiding Officers more than it does to the Joint Select Committee;
- ii. The advertisement carried in the daily newspapers and the Kenya *Gazette* on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 was not clear on what entailed the qualifications of an elected Member of Parliament;
- iii. The Nomination day for candidates nominated by political parties and candidates independent of political parties should be different so as not to disadvantage and disenfranchise the independent candidates in terms of waiting time;
- iv. Rule 11(1) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 states that withdrawal of candidates shall not be accepted after four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day. This provision is restrictive to candidates who may wish to withdraw before election day;
- v. Rule 14 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 provides for campaigns by nominees, who may approach and seek the support of Members of Parliament. However, candidates who are not former Members of Parliament or familiar with the Precincts of Parliament may difficulties to accessing and seeking support of the Members of Parliament for purposes of campaign;
- vi. Section 24(1)(c) of the Elections Act, 2011 should not apply to candidates seeking election to the membership of the East African Legislative Assembly as the East African Legislative Assembly being a regional Parliament, the geographical area in terms of signatures should be countrywide and not confined to registered voters in a constituency or county



The Committee tasked the Co-chairpersons to approach both Speakers and pursue the possibility of nominees addressing Members in an informal gathering (Kamukunji).

Mr. Nicholas Emejen and Ms. Emmy Chepkwony, represented the Clerk of the National Assembly and the Clerk of the Senate respectively. On behalf of the Presiding Officers they handed over the twenty eight (28) files to the Joint Select Committee. These included fifteen from the majority coalition Kenya Kwanza, twelve from the minority coalition Azimio, and one for an independent candidate.

The Joint Committee passed their gratitude to the Presiding Officers for the work done during the nomination day.

**Briefing on the Outcome of Inspection Days**

The representatives of the Presiding officers briefed the Members as follows;

1. In accordance with Rule 12, the inspection days were done on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> November 2022, at Mini Chambers, County Hall, Parliament Buildings, for any interested member of the public to inspect the nomination papers and file complaints, if any.
2. The following written complaints were lodged;
  - a. Hon. Chirau Ali Mwakwere through his Advocates, M/S Gikera Vadgama submitted a letter on 10th November, 2022, alleging that –
    - i. The *Azimio* Coalition had received a list of all applicants from the Clerks of the National Assembly and the Senate for distribution to affiliate parties. The list was not delivered to Wiper Headquarters.

- ii. Fake minutes from Wiper Headquarters dated 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022, a date before the deadline of 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 of submission of applications for EALA, were used to confirm that three names were purportedly deliberated and approved by the Wiper Management Committee meeting of 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022.
  - iii. Candidate, Hellen Mueni Ndeti's application to the Clerks of both the National Assembly and the Senate is dated 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 yet the advert for EALA applications was issued on the 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2022.
- b. Mr. Abdulaziz Gakuria submitted a letter on 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 alleging that-
- i. Ms. Hellen Mueni Ndeti purports to have made an application for her EALA nominated in a letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 yet the first advert appeared on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022.
  - ii. Ms. Winfred S. Mutua made her application on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022 but indications are that it was received a day after the meeting of the WDM National Management Committee.
  - iii. The WDM National Management Committee met on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022 to make a decision yet the deadline for applications was 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022. This locked out and disenfranchised any applicants who may have applied to the Clerks of the Senate and the National Assembly directly.
  - iv. He doubts the authenticity of the minutes provided by WDM.
- c. Mr. Fredrick Kioko Musau submitted a letter on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 stating that he is aggrieved by his Party's decision – Wiper Democratic Movement to leave out his name from the final shortlist through a process that was not transparent and inclusive.
- d. He further requested for the official list of all the EALA nomination applicants who submitted their documents and a certified copy of the minutes presented by WDM Kenya which contained the instructions of the final list proposed for nomination. He intends to appeal to the Dispute Tribunal.
- e. Mr. Matthew Malusi submitted a letter on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 alleging that –
- i. The Wiper Movement from Nairobi branch have been left out of the nomination process despite presenting a candidate.
  - ii. Wiper has nominated persons who are members of county assemblies;

The Joint Committee resolved to consider the complaints in its next sitting.

**Complaint by Mr. Abdulaziz Gakuria**



- i. On the allegation that some applications were received outside the specified application window, the Joint Select Committee observed-
  - a. procedures for commencing applications are governed by the EALA (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017. Pursuant to Rule 4, the Presiding Officers are required to notify and invite members of the public to apply within seven days from the date of notice, for nomination to be elected as a member of the East African Legislative Assembly;
  - b. consequently, the Clerks of the two Houses of Parliament placed the advertisements in the Newspapers and Kenya *Gazette* on 26<sup>th</sup> October requiring receipt of applications by 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022;
- ii. On allegation that Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua made her application on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2022, but indications are that it was received on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November a day after the meeting of the WDM National Management Committee, the Joint Select Committee observed that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution.
- iii. On allegation that WDM National Management Committee met on 1<sup>st</sup> November to make decision, yet the deadline for applications was 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 locking out and disenfranchising some applicants, the Joint Select Committee observed that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution.
- iv. On the allegation that the Minutes from Wiper Democratic Movement Party Headquarters were not authentic, the Joint Select Committee observed that, neither the Presiding Officers nor the Joint Select Committee are privy to the party deliberations, further, the names of the nominees of the Wiper Democratic Party and the Minutes were submitted by the Leader of the Minority Party representing the *Azimio la Umoja* One Kenya Coalition as contemplated in Rule 10.
- v. On the request, to the Presiding Officers to furnish names that have undergone proper party vetting, the Joint Select Committee observed that, pursuant to Rule 7, the Presiding Officers wrote a letter to Majority and Minority Party leaders requesting them to submit the name of their respective nominees for election on nomination day which was set for Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022. Consequently, the question as to proper party vetting of the nominees before submission to the Presiding Officers, rests with the political parties.

#### **Complaint by Mr. Fredrick Kioko Musau**

- i. he was aggrieved by the decision by WDM-K to leave out his name from the final shortlist through a process that was not transparent and inclusive. The Joint Select Committee that the matter ought to be referred to the relevant internal party organs for resolution
- ii. he further be furnished with the list of all applicants for nomination and election to the membership of EALA and a certified copy of the minutes presented by the WDM-K. The Joint Select Committee observed that the complainant is entitled, under Article 35 of the Constitution to access any information that is in custody of Parliament and the said information was availed to the complainant.

The Committee was informed that IEBC had conducted verification of Signatures submitted by Mr. Duuncan Mwangi Ndegwa and verdict was as follows-

That IEBC had scrutinized and verified the following-

1. The booklets containing total of 2003 records of supports, booklet one had 627 records and booklet two had 1376 records.
2. That 906 of supports attached copies of their national identifications while 1097 did not attached that same.
3. Tat Commission through the verification process of the records, confirmation that the nominee has been supported by 924 registered voters out of which 337 belong to Limuru Constituency.
4. The Commission also noted that the candidate did not submit any document that proves that he is not a member of any registered political party / certificate of Clearance ) as prescribed by Article 85(a) of the Kenya Constitution. IEBC therefore confirmed that the nominee has not met the requisite threshold as provided for in Article 99 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

The Committee noted the report of the IEBC and resolved that the Applicant be excluded could not qualify to be included in the Ballot paper.

The Committee observed that in future the candidate should clear with IEBC and submit evidence of clearance to avoid disqualification of candidates who have already started the campaigning amongst members of Parliament.

Further the Committee confirmed and adopted the minutes of the same sitting.

**1. COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Having analyzed the applications and the Presiding Officers reports and other submissions, the committee makes the following observations-
  - (a) **Mandate of the Joint Select Committee** - The Joint Select Committee noted that the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 does not assign the Joint Select Committee prominent role in the electoral process.
  - (b) **Advertisement calling for Applications** – Despite the advertisement by the presiding officers carried in the daily newspapers and the Kenya Gazette on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, the Joint Select Committee noted that, majority of the candidates seem not to have referred to the requisite provisions of the Constitutional and statutory requirements in respect to qualifications.





(c) **Withdrawal of a Candidate** - Rule 11(1) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 states that withdrawal of candidates shall not be accepted after four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day. This provision is restrictive to candidates who may wish to withdraw before Election Day.

(d) **Campaigns by Nominees** - Rule 14 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 provides for campaigns by nominees, who may approach and seek the support of Members of Parliament. However, candidates who are not former Members of Parliament or familiar with the Precincts of Parliament may have difficulties accessing and seeking support of the Members of Parliament for purposes of campaign.

2. Based on the foregoing, the Committee therefore makes the following **recommendations**-

(i) Amendment of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 to enhance the role of the Joint Select Committee in whole process commencing the invitation of applications to the submission of names to the East African Legislative Assembly.

(ii) Amendment of the following Rules of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017-

i. Rule 11 on the withdrawal of candidature be amended to allow candidates to withdraw at any time before the election day; and

ii. Rule 14 on the campaigns by nominees be amended to include a framework for campaigns to ensure all nominees, whether former members of Parliament or not have an equal opportunity to campaign.

(iii) **Withdrawal of Candidate** - Rule 11(1) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 states that withdrawal of candidates shall not be accepted after four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day. This provision is restrictive and unfair to candidates who may wish to withdraw before election day.

(iv) **That**, having met all requirements under the Constitution of Kenya, the East African Community Treaty, Elections Act, 2011 and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the



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**THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY  
ELECTIONS ACT 2012**

**An Act to make provision for election of the members of the East African Legislative Assembly and to provide for other related matters.**

*Date of assent* 15th April, 2012.

*Date of commencement* See Section 1.

ENACTED by the East African Community and assented to by the Heads of State.

**PART I—PRELIMINARY**

1. This Act may be cited as the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2012 and shall come into force on such day as the Council may, by notice published in the Gazette appoint.

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires—

pretation.

“Assembly” means the East African Legislative Assembly established by Article 9 of the Treaty;

“candidate” means a person who is duly nominated in accordance with rules of procedure of the respective National Assembly to stand for election to the Assembly;

“Clerk” means the Clerk to the Assembly appointed under Article 48 of the Treaty;

“election” means an election to the Assembly in accordance with the provisions of this Act;

“member” means a member of the Assembly elected in accordance with this Act;

“National Assembly” with its grammatical variation and cognate expression means the national legislature however designated of a Partner State;

“Secretary General” means the Secretary General of the East African Community provided for by Article 67 of the Treaty;

“Speaker” means the Speaker of the Assembly provided for under Article 53 of the Treaty;

“Treaty” means the Treaty for the establishment of the East African Community.

PART II—ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY

Notification.

3. The Clerk shall, in not less than ninety days before the expiry of the Assembly notify the Speaker of the National Assembly of each Partner State to cause the election of the members of the next Assembly.

Election of members.

4. (1) The National Assembly of each Partner State shall, in accordance with its rules of procedure elect not from among its members, nine members of the Assembly.

(2) The National Assembly shall elect members of the Assembly within ninety days before the expiry date of the outgoing Assembly.

(3) The members elected under sub section (1) shall in as much as it is feasible represent—

- (a) political parties represented in the National Assembly;
- (b) shades of opinion;
- (c) gender; and
- (d) special interest groups in that Partner State.

(4) At least one third of the elected members shall reflect either gender.

5. The Speaker of the National Assembly of each Partner State shall immediately after election of members of the Assembly, transmit the names to the Clerk of the Assembly.

6. (1) Any question that may arise whether any person is an elected member of the Assembly or whether any seat in the Assembly is vacant shall be determined by the institution of the Partner State that determines questions of the election of members of the National Assembly responsible for the election in question.

(2) The National Assembly of the Partner State shall notify the Speaker of the Assembly of every determination made under subsection (1).

7. (1) Subject to this section, an elected member of the Assembly shall hold office for five years and be eligible for re-election for a further term of five years.

(2) The terms and conditions of service of the members of the Assembly shall be determined by the Summit on the recommendation of the Council.

*East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2012*

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(3) An elected member of the Assembly shall vacate his or her seat in the Assembly upon the happening of any of the following events—

- (a) upon the delivery of his or her resignation in writing to the Speaker of the Assembly;
- (b) upon his or her ceasing to be qualified for election as an elected member;
- (c) upon his or her election or nomination as a member of the National Assembly of a Partner State;
- (d) upon his or her appointment as a Minister in the Government of a Partner State;
- (e) upon his or her having been absent from the Assembly for such period and in such circumstances as are prescribed by the rules of procedure of the Assembly;
- (f) upon his or her conviction by a Court of competent jurisdiction, of an offence and sentenced to imprisonment for a term exceeding six months and if no appeal has been preferred against such a decision;
- (g) upon his or her appointment as an officer in the service of the Community;
- (h) upon the dissolution of the Assembly; or
- (i) upon death.

8. (1) The Speaker of the Assembly shall notify the Speaker of the National Assembly of the Partner State on the existence of a vacancy under this Act.

(2) After notification of a vacancy under subsection (1), a bye – election shall be held within a period of 90 days.

9. (1) A bye – election shall be conducted whenever a member of the Assembly— Bye-election.

(a) dies; or

(b) where the seat of a member of the Assembly becomes vacant under this Act.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a member of the Assembly elected under this section shall serve for the remaining term of the Assembly.

(3) A bye-election shall not be held under this section within six months before the expiry of the term of the Assembly except where failure to hold the election affects the quorum of the Assembly.

### PART III—MISCELLANEOUS

10. (1) A session of the first meeting of the Assembly shall be convened by the Clerk in Arusha in the United Republic of Tanzania. Sessions of the Assembly.

(2) Subject to Article 55(1) of the Treaty the Assembly shall determine the venue and appropriate periods of its sessions and sittings.

11. The Assembly shall stand dissolved at the expiration of the 5 year term. Dissolution of the Assembly.

12. The National Assembly of each Partner State shall make rules governing the procedure for election of members subject to this Act and Article 50 of the Treaty. Procedure for election of members.

### STATEMENT

BUSINESS FOR THE WEEK OF 17<sup>TH</sup> TO 21<sup>ST</sup> OCTOBER 2022

**Hon. Kimani Ichung'wah** (Kikuyu, UDA): Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 44(2) (a), I rise to give Statement on behalf of the House Business Committee which met on Tuesday, 11<sup>th</sup> October 2022 in the afternoon following its formation to prioritise business for consideration. Members will recall that yesterday, Wednesday, 12<sup>th</sup> October 2022, in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 28, this House approved the calendar of the National Assembly for the regular sessions of the First Session. Therefore, the House is now scheduled to proceed for its recess tomorrow, Friday, 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022, and resume the regular Sittings on Tuesday, 25<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

Hon. Speaker, for the information of Members, during the recess, the Committee on Appointments is expected to undertake the vetting of persons who are nominated to the positions of Cabinet Secretaries, Attorney-General and the Secretary to the Cabinet, and table its Report on this matter when we resume regular Sittings. Further, the Committee on Selection will also consider the placement of Members in the various parliamentary committees. This will, therefore, be a working recess for those of us who sit in the Committee on Appointments and the Committee on Selection. I urge the House to be patient as these processes are ongoing and take the opportunity of this short break, as we said yesterday, to connect or bond with our families and constituents. Following the elections that we had, many of us have not had an opportunity to go back to our constituencies and families.

Finally, the House Business Committee will reconvene on 25<sup>th</sup> October 2022 to schedule the business for the week of resumption of the House. I now wish to lay this Statement on the Table of the House.

### MOTION

APPOINTMENT OF JOINT PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE ON ELECTION  
OF MEMBERS TO EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

**Hon. Speaker:** Leader of the Majority Party.

**Hon. Kimani Ichung'wah** (Kikuyu, UDA): Hon. Speaker, I beg to move the following Motion:

THAT, acknowledging that the East Africa Legislative Assembly (EALA) is established under Article 9 of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community as one of the key organs and institutions of the Community responsible for the Community's legislative matters;

Recognising that Article 50 of the Treaty provides for the election of Members of EALA by respective partner states' legislatures in accordance with their parliamentary procedures for a term of five years;

Further aware that the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 contemplates conclusion of the election of Members of a new Assembly to be within 90 days before the expiry of the term of the subsisting Assembly;

Noting that the term of the current East African Legislative Assembly lapses on 17<sup>th</sup> December 2022;

Cognisant of the need to urgently conclude the election process for the East African Legislative Assembly to commence transacting business of the East African Community;

Now therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 9 of the Houses of Parliament (Joint Sitzings) Rules, the House resolves:

(i) to establish a Joint Committee consisting of seven Members appointed by each of the Houses of Parliament to undertake the functions contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017;

(ii) that the following Members shall represent the National Assembly in the Joint Committee:

- (a) The Hon. Wanjiku Muhia, M.P. - Co-Chairperson
- (b) The Hon. (Dr.) Makali Mulu, CBS, M.P.
- (c) The Hon. Sabina Chege, CBS, M.P.
- (d) The John Mutunga Kanyuithia, M.P.
- (e) Hon. Daniel Nanok Epuyo, M.P.
- (f) Hon. Francis Sigei Kipyegon, M.P.
- (g) Hon. Ruth Adhiambo Busia, M.P.

(iii) that the Offices of the Clerks of the Houses of Parliament shall provide secretariat services to the Joint Committee in accordance with the Standing Orders; and

(iv) that the Joint Committee shall report to the House within the timelines stipulated in the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.

As I have stated in the Motion, the EALA is an independent legislative arm of our East African Community (EAC) that was established under Article 9 of the EAC Treaty. As Members are aware and for the benefit of our new Members, we have nine Members who are elected by each partner State. Kenya being a partner State in the Community, we will elect these nine Members. The purpose of this Joint Committee is to guide us through the process of electing these Members. That is why you see that we have representation from across the political divide, representing all our parliamentary political parties. We assume that the interests of the non-parliamentary political parties are catered for under our coalitions. However, the list of names that we have submitted have representation from all parliamentary political parties.



The EALA plays a very critical role in furtherance of the EAC objectives such as liaising with the National Assemblies of the partner States on matters relating to the Community. It also debates and approves the Budget of the Community. It also considers the annual Reports on the activities of the Community, annual audit reports and any other report. It also discusses all matters regarding the Community and makes recommendations, as it may deem necessary, for the implementation of the Community treaty.

Rule 9 of the Houses of Parliament for Joint Sittings, as I said, establishes the Joint Committee by way of a Motion which we have just tabled. It consists of membership from both Houses. This list that we are approving here is that of the National Assembly. The other House will also have its list. That is why we have designated Hon. Wanjiku Muhia who is not only a ranking Member of the House but she is also an immediate former Member of EALA. So, she is very well-versed with the affairs of EALA and the provisions of the EAC Treaty, and what needs to be done.

As I mentioned earlier, the term of the fourth Assembly that Hon. Wanjiku Muhia and Hon. Jematiah, who is also here, are Members comes to an end on 17<sup>th</sup> December this year. The fifth Assembly is expected to commence its sittings early in 2023. Therefore, Members know that the Parliament of Kenya is required to conduct the election of its Members to EALA latest by 17<sup>th</sup> December 2022. However, the elections were not carried out immediately as the 12<sup>th</sup> Parliament ended on 10<sup>th</sup> June. Members remember that we took our *sine die* adjournment in June. We could not carry out the elections for the Members who would have replaced the outgoing ones. Therefore, this 13<sup>th</sup> Parliament is required to conclude this process urgently for the EALA to commence transacting its business, and avoid the scenario that we witnessed in the last elections of the Members of the Assembly in 2017. We are within time. However, it is very important to establish this Committee before we go on recess from tomorrow. As the other two Committees—Committee on Appointments and Committee on Selection—are working, they may also now reconstitute and begin to prepare the timetable and programme that will guide us to conduct the elections. They will also guide us on when they will advertise for the positions. The entire timetable is to enable us come back and elect our new Members to EALA. With the passage of this Motion and that in the Senate, it may as well serve as a notice to those who are out there. Nobody seated here is electable to EALA but I know many of our colleagues whom we were with in the 12<sup>th</sup> Parliament who are interested. They may as well be notified through the passage of this Motion that the process has begun and they can therefore begin their campaigns and they will be guided by the Committee.

With those many remarks, I beg to move. I will ask the Leader of the Minority Party, Hon. Opiyo Wandayi, to second this Motion.

Thank you.

**Hon. Opiyo Wandayi** (Ugunja, ODM): Hon. Speaker, I wish to second the Motion for the adoption of the six names to form part of the Joint Committee that will oversee election of Members to EALA.

Without belabouring the point, we cannot get the importance of EALA in a wider context of our desire as East Africans to eventually end up within one political federation. It is therefore in our interest that EALA continues to play its rightful role, and continues to get strengthened so that as East Africans, we will eventually bring down all artificial barriers that divide our people.

It is also important that we go about these elections properly as envisaged by the East African Community Treaty. It is on record that previously, when we did not get it right, the courts had to intervene. Indeed, the East African Court of Justice in Prof. Anyang Nyong'o's case settled the matter of how to go about election of Members to EALA by respective partner states.



3. That, the quorum of the joint sittings will be the respective quorums of each of the Sub-Committees as stipulated by the respective Standing Orders.

4. That, as contemplated under Rule 9 (6) of the joint rules, unless a decision is reached by consensus, any vote to be taken in the joint sittings of the committees shall be by separate Houses. This will ensure that the numerical difference of the individual Members representing the Houses in the joint sittings has no effect on the decisions of the joint sittings of the Committee.

5. That the Committees shall having conducted the vetting hearings, submit a joint report to the respective Houses in the manner contemplated by Paragraph 7 of the Joint Rule 9.

Hon. Senators, Section 8 (1) of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act, 2011. States: -

“Unless otherwise provided in any law, a Committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the relevant House for debate, and decision within 28 days from the date on which the notification of nomination was given in accordance with Section (5).

Section 9 of the Act, Further states: -

“If after the expiry of the period for consideration specified in Section 8, Parliament has neither approved nor rejected the nomination of a candidate, the candidate shall be deemed to have been approved.”

In this regard, the period on the matter that is now before Parliament, starts running upon the Speaker of the National Assembly committing the name of the nominee to the Departmental Committees on Administration and Internal Affairs.

Hon. Senators, Standing Order No. 77 (1) of the Senate Standing Orders provides that upon receipt of a notification of nomination for appointment to a public office required to be approved by the Senate under the Constitution of any other legislation, the nomination shall stand committed to the relevant Standing Committee for consideration.

This Message, therefore, together with the resume of the nominee, stands committed to the Standing Committee National Security, Defense and Foreign Relations of the Senate for vetting jointly with the Departmental Committee on Administration and Internal Affairs of the National Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the National Police Service Act, Public Appointment and Parliamentary Approval Act and the Standing Orders of the Houses of the Parliament.

### THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS ACT, 2011

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 12 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, the Parliament of Kenya makes the following Rules:—

#### THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS (ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY) RULES, 2017

##### PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. These Rules may be cited as the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.

Citation.

2. In these Rules, the parliamentary words and expressions used have the same meaning as that assigned to them in the Standing Orders of the respective House of Parliament and unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“candidate” means a person who is nominated to vie for election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

“election” means an election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

“joint committee” means a committee established by the National Assembly and the Senate for the purposes of elections conducted under these Rules;

“nomination” means nomination as a candidate to vie for election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

“party” means a parliamentary political party or coalition of parliamentary political parties;

“presiding officers” means the Clerk of the National Assembly and the Clerk of the Senate;

“returning officers” means the Speaker of the National Assembly and the Speaker of the Senate; and

“voter” means a member of the National Assembly or the Senate but does not include the Speaker of either House of Parliament.

##### PART II—QUALIFICATIONS AND NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

3. A person shall not qualify to vie for election unless he or she meets the requirements for election set out under Article 50(2) of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 22 of the Elections Act.

Qualification for  
election.

No. 24 of 2011.

4. Where an election is to be held, the presiding officers shall, by notice in the Gazette and in at least two newspapers of national circulation—

Notification of election and nomination date.

- (a) notify that fact and invite interested qualified persons to apply, within a period of seven days from the date of the notice, for nomination to be elected as a member of the East African Legislative Assembly; and
- (b) appoint a nomination day, which shall be within a period of seven days from the expiry of the period prescribed under paragraph (a) for the receipt of applications for nomination.

5. A person who qualifies for nomination shall submit his or her application for nomination to the specified political party of his or her choice in the manner specified in the notice published under rule 4.

Application for nomination by a political party.

6. (1) A party shall be entitled to nominate for election under these Rules any number of candidates not exceeding three times the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of elected Members of Parliament of that party by such number as Joint Committee shall determine and dividing the result by the total number of elected Members of Parliament.

Number of nominees of each party.

(2) In nominating its candidates, each party shall, as much as it is feasible, take into account the need for fair representation of the various shades of opinion, regional balance, gender and other special interest groups in Kenya and shall ensure that at least one third of its nominees are women.

7. The presiding officers may, before the expiry of the period prescribed under rule 4(b) invite the respective leader of the majority party and the leader of the minority party of all parties entitled to nominate candidates for a pre-nomination briefing on the nomination requirements under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, the East Africa Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 and under these Rules.

Pre-nomination briefing.

8. (1) Upon the nomination of a candidate under these Rules, the respective political party or the nominee, as the case may be, shall submit the particulars of the nominee in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to the presiding officer in the manner prescribed under rule 10.

Nomination of candidates by a political party.

(2) The nomination of a candidate by a political party shall not be valid unless the candidate or political party submits to the presiding officer, the prescribed form duly filled and certified by the leader of the majority party or the leader of the minority party, as the case may be, in the manner set out in the form.

(3) Each party shall nominate candidates through a transparent and democratic process and shall keep a written record of the proceedings at which the final decision to nominate any candidate was made.

9. A person intending to vie for election independent of a political party shall submit his or her duly filled nomination form in the format prescribed in Second Schedule to a presiding officer in the

Nomination of candidates independent of a political party.

manner specified in the notice published under rule 4 and in accordance with rule 10.

10. On the day of nomination, at any time not later than four o'clock in the afternoon, an independent candidate or a nominee, the leader of the majority party or the leader of the minority party, as the case may be, of all parties entitled to nominate candidates shall deliver nomination papers of the candidate or candidates nominated by the party to the presiding officer.

Delivery of  
nomination papers.

11. (1) A candidate may, not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day, withdraw his or her candidature by notice in writing signed and delivered to the presiding officer, and in the case of a candidate nominated by a political party, with a copy to the party leader of the party that nominated the candidate.

Withdrawal or death  
of a candidate.

(2) No withdrawal of a candidate shall be accepted after the expiry of the period prescribed under sub-rule (1).

(3) Where the presiding officer receives information that a candidate has died and the information is received after four o'clock in the afternoon of the nomination day, and before the election day, the election shall proceed, but the voters shall be informed of such death.

(4) In the case of a party nominee, the party which nominated the candidate who dies or for any other reason ceases to be a candidate before the election day, may notwithstanding rule 10, nominate another person in place of the candidate.

12. Subject to such conditions as the presiding officers may prescribe, any person may, during office hours for two working days from the nomination day, inspect the nomination papers of any candidate and may lodge a complaint with the presiding officers in relation to a candidate's nomination.

Inspection of  
nomination papers.

13. (1) Within three days after the expiry of the period provided for in rule 10, the presiding officers shall forward to the joint committee, for its consideration, the names and nomination papers of all duly nominated candidates together with any complaint that may have been received under rule 12.

Forwarding of  
nomination papers to  
joint committee.

(2) The joint committee may, in considering nomination papers under sub-rule (1), invite to appear before the committee, the respective nominee in order to verify any information affecting his or her qualification to vie for elections under these Rules.

(3) The joint committee may, upon considering the nomination papers of a candidate make a recommendation for the rejection of the papers of the candidate if it is apparent from the contents of the papers that the candidate is not qualified to vie for election.

(4) The joint committee may make a recommendation for the rejection of all nominations and order a fresh nomination if it is apparent from the list of nominees that it shall not be possible, upon the holding of elections, to have, as much as is feasible, a fair representation of the various political parties in Parliament, regional

balance, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in Kenya and to ensure that at least not more than two thirds of the persons elected are of the same gender.

(5) The joint committee shall consider the nomination papers and table its report on the nominees in both Houses of Parliament within a period of seven days from the date of receipt of the papers.

(6) In the event that Parliament approves the recommendation of the joint committee for a fresh nomination, the presiding officer may shorten the periods specified under rule 4.

### PART III—ELECTION CAMPAIGNS AND VOTING

14. An aspiring candidate may approach and seek the support of a Member of Parliament entitled to vote before the nomination day and may, if nominated, continue to do so after the nomination day.

15. (1) The presiding officers shall, by notice published in the Gazette and in at least two newspapers of national circulation appoint a date and a venue for the holding of the election by the respective Houses of Parliament which shall be not more than fourteen days after the nomination day.

Publication of  
election date.

(2) The date and time for election appointed under sub-rule (1) shall be the same for the National Assembly and the Senate.

16. (1) Each presiding officer shall prepare and at the time appointed for the election, shall issue to each voter one ballot paper on which shall be written in alphabetical order, the names of all duly nominated candidates, their gender, age and county clustered under the heading of the names of the respective parties that nominated them.

Ballot paper.

(2) A voter shall be required to cast a specified number of votes, which shall be clearly indicated on the ballot paper, in respect of the candidates nominated by each party.

(3) The number of votes cast under sub-rule (2) in respect of each party shall be the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of Members of Parliament of that party by the number determined by the Joint Committee and dividing the result by the total number of Members of Parliament.

17. (1) The voting in each House shall be conducted under the general supervision of the respective Speaker, who shall be the returning officer, in the place appointed by the Speaker.

Voting.

(2) On receiving a ballot paper, a voter shall secretly record his or her votes by putting a mark against the names of the nine candidates that the voter wishes to elect as members of the East African Legislative Assembly, in the respective proportions specified under sub-rule (3) of rule 15.

(3) A voter shall cast as many votes as the number of candidates to be elected and in proportion to the number of candidates required to be elected as shall be determined by the Joint Committee.

(4) Where a voter casts more votes than the number of candidates required to be elected with respect to a category of candidates, the ballot paper of that voter shall be regarded as spoilt.

(5) The ballot paper of a voter shall not be regarded as spoilt where the voter casts a number of votes that falls below the number of candidates to be elected in an election conducted under these Rules.

(6) A voter who accidentally spoils a ballot paper while voting is in progress shall, on surrendering the spoilt ballot paper, be issued with a replacement ballot paper.

18. (1) Immediately after all voters have cast their votes, the respective returning officer shall appoint two members to act as counting agents for all the candidates.

Counting of votes.

(2) The respective presiding officer shall, in the presence of the counting agents as witnesses, count the votes cast.

19. When the votes have been counted and the results of the election have been ascertained—

Declaration of results.

- (a) each presiding officer shall record the results of the tally and report to the respective House the results of the election together with the number of votes recorded for each candidate under each cluster at the end of the election exercise;
- (b) the returning officer in each House shall the upon reporting the results of the elections under paragraph (a), send a message to the other House communicating the results of the election in the respective House;
- (c) the returning officer shall announce to the respective House, the results of the election in the other House; and
- (d) the returning officer in the National Assembly shall declare to be duly elected as members of the East African Legislative Assembly, nine persons who receive the highest number of votes.

20. Within seven days after the declaration of the duly elected members of the East African Legislative Assembly under rule 19 (d)—

Publication and transmission of names.

- (a) the presiding officers shall publish the names in the *Gazette*; and
- (b) the returning officers shall jointly transmit to the Clerk of the East African Legislative Assembly the names of the elected members as published in the *Gazette*.

21. The presiding officers of the respective Houses of Parliament shall ensure safe custody of all ballot papers and other documents relating to the conduct of the election and shall cause all such documents to be destroyed after the expiration of six months from the election day.

Custody of ballot papers.

#### PART IV—VOIDANCE OF ELECTION

22. Any question that may arise as to whether a person is an elected member of the East African Legislative Assembly or whether a seat in the Assembly is vacant shall be determined by the High Court.

Determination of validity of candidate's election.

23. The procedure, jurisdiction and grounds for election petitions in respect of a Member of Parliament shall apply *mutatis mutandis* for a

Procedure for voidance of elections.



Member of the East African Legislative Assembly elected under these Rules.

#### PART V—MISCELLANEOUS

24. Where the seat of a member elected under these Rules becomes vacant, the Speakers shall, upon receipt of notification of the vacancy from the Speaker of the East African Legislative Assembly, facilitate the election of a member to replace the member in accordance with the procedure set out under these Rules.

Filling of vacancy.

25. If any matter arises which is not specifically provided for in these Rules, the respective Speakers shall make a ruling directing what is to be done and in making such a ruling, the Speakers shall be guided by the practice and procedure normally followed in similar situations with regard to the conduct of elections in Parliament.

Matters not specifically provided for.

26. These Rules supercede any previous rules, procedure or practice for the election of members to the East African Legislative Assembly.

Supercession

27. The Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2001 and the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2012 are revoked.

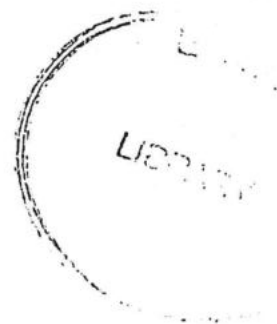

“National Assembly” with its grammatical variation and cognate expression means the national legislature however designated of a Partner State;

“Secretary General” means the Secretary General of the East African Community provided for by Article 67 of the Treaty;

“Speaker” means the Speaker of the Assembly provided for under Article 53 of the Treaty;

“Treaty” means the Treaty for the establishment of the East African Community.

PART II—ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY

Notification.

3. The Clerk shall, in not less than ninety days before the expiry of the Assembly notify the Speaker of the National Assembly of each Partner State to cause the election of the members of the next Assembly.

Election of members.

4. (1) The National Assembly of each Partner State shall, in accordance with its rules of procedure elect not from among its members, nine members of the Assembly.

(2) The National Assembly shall elect members of the Assembly within ninety days before the expiry date of the outgoing Assembly.

*East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011*

(3) The members elected under sub section (1) shall in as much as it is feasible represent—

- (a) political parties represented in the National Assembly;
- (b) shades of opinion;
- (c) gender; and
- (d) special interest groups in that Partner State.

(4) At least one third of the elected members shall reflect either gender.

5. The Speaker of the National Assembly of each Partner State shall immediately after election of members of the Assembly, transmit the names to the Clerk of the Assembly.

(1) Any question that may arise whether any person is an elected member of the Assembly or whether any seat in the Assembly is vacant shall be determined by the institution of the Partner State that determines questions of the election of members of the National Assembly responsible for the election in question.

(2) The National Assembly of the Partner State shall notify the Speaker of the Assembly of every determination made under subsection (1).

7. (1) Subject to this section, an elected member of the Assembly shall hold office for five years and be eligible for re-election for a further term of five years.

(2) The terms and conditions of service of the members of the Assembly shall be determined by the Summit on the recommendation of the Council.

(3) An elected member of the Assembly shall vacate his or her seat in the Assembly upon the happening of any of the following events—

- (a) upon the delivery of his or her resignation in writing to the Speaker of the Assembly;
- (b) upon his or her ceasing to be qualified for election as an elected member;
- (c) upon his or her election or nomination as a member of the National Assembly of a Partner State;
- (d) upon his or her appointment as a Minister in the Government of a Partner State;
- (e) upon his or her having been absent from the Assembly for such period and in such circumstances as are prescribed by the rules of procedure of the Assembly;
- (f) upon his or her conviction by a Court of competent jurisdiction, of an offence and sentenced to imprisonment for a term exceeding six months and if no appeal has been preferred against such a decision;
- (g) upon his or her appointment as an officer in the service of the Community;
- (h) upon the dissolution of the Assembly; or
- (i) upon death.

8. (1) The Speaker of the Assembly shall notify the Speaker of the National Assembly of the Partner State on the existence of a vacancy under this Act.

*East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011*

(2) After notification of a vacancy under subsection (1), a bye – election shall be held within a period of 90 days.

9. (1) A bye – election shall be conducted whenever a member of the Assembly— Bye-election.

(a) dies; or

(b) where the seat of a member of the Assembly becomes vacant under this Act.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a member of the Assembly elected under this section shall serve for the remaining term of the Assembly.

(3) A bye-election shall not be held under this section within six months before the expiry of the term of the Assembly except where failure to hold the election affects the quorum of the Assembly.

PART III—MISCELLANEOUS

10. (1) A session of the first meeting of the Assembly shall be convened by the Clerk in Arusha in the United Republic of Tanzania. Sessions of the Assembly.

(2) Subject to Article 55(1) of the Treaty the Assembly shall determine the venue and appropriate periods of its sessions and sittings.

11. The Assembly shall stand dissolved at the expiration of the 5 year term. Dissolution of the Assembly.

12. The National Assembly of each Partner State shall make rules governing the procedure for election of members subject to this Act and Article 50 of the Treaty. Procedure for election of members.

Reference is made to the above subject matter and letter from the Clerks of both Houses of Parliament dated 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, Ref PARL/EALA/GEN-CORR/VOL./004, requesting the Commission to confirm whether or not, as required under Article 99(1)(c) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the lists submitted by the independent candidate, Mr. Duncan Mwangi Ndegwa of ID No. 7039426, as persons supporting his nomination, are registered as voters in Limuru Constituency. The supporting signatures were in two booklets.

In compliance with Article 99(1) (c) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, the Commission undertook a verification exercise to confirm whether the nominee is supported by at least one thousand registered voters in the case of the National Assembly or two thousand registered voters in the case of Senate.

Upon scrutiny of the records, the Commission noted the following:

1. The booklets contained total of 2003 records of supporters. Booklet one had 627 records and booklet two had 1376 records.
2. That 906 of the supporters attached copies of their national identities while 1097 did not attached the same.
3. The Commission through the verification process of the records, confirms that the nominee has been supported by 924 registered voters out of which 337 belong to Limuru Constituency.

The Commission also noted that the candidate did not submit any document that proves that he is not a member of any registered political party (Certificate of Clearance) as prescribed by Article 85(a) of the Kenya Constitution.

This therefore is to confirm that the nominee has not met the requisite threshold as provided for in Article 99 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

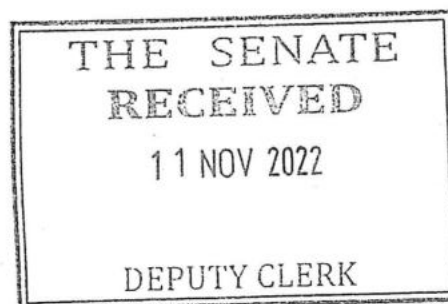

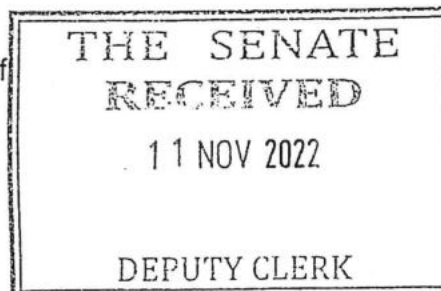
We represent Hon. Chirau Ali Mwakwere who has instructed us to address you as follows:

Parliament advertised on its official website an invitation for applications for nomination and election to the Membership of the EALA. Pursuant to the advertisement, our client submitted his application on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022 together with certified copies of certificates to the Clerk of the National Assembly indicating that he sought to be nominated by his political party Wiper Democratic Movement (hereinafter "Wiper").

On 7<sup>th</sup> November 2022 or thereabouts, Parliament's Joint Committee on Election of EALA had a pre-nomination briefing in which parties were instructed to select their three preferred representatives for interviews and voting by Parliament.

We understand from our client that EALA has reserved nine seats for Kenya. Five of the nine seats have been allocated to Kenya Kwanza Coalition and four to Azimio La Umoja Coalition. For the latter coalition, it is expected that one (1) out of the four (4) seats will go to Wiper.

Our client is reliably informed that the Azimio coalition, through the leader of minority received a list of all applicants from the clerks of the National Assembly and the Senate for distribution to the affiliate parties. Our client further informs us that the said list was not delivered to Wiper Headquarters. Ironically, fake minutes from Wiper Headquarters

- no committee has been convened by Wiper to consider the applicants seeking to be Wiper party nominees for EALA; and
- no official communication has been issued by Wiper to parliament or Azimio regarding the applicant's selected for nomination to EALA through Wiper.


Given our client's role in the party, and his open expression of interest, he would be aware if any of the above actions were taken by Wiper after close of applications on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022.

We understand that the inspection of the nomination papers submitted by the parties is currently taking place along with the interviews, with the intention of Parliament voting on 17 November 2022.

Our client believes and rightly so, that he should be cleared for vetting by Parliament. We are therefore requested to **DEMAND** that our client be considered as a candidate for Wiper and be cleared and subjected to cleared for vetting by Parliament. Our client did submit his application to parliament in good time. As the Chairperson of Wiper he confirms that Wiper has not held any meeting after closure of applications to deliberate and nominate Wiper candidates for EALA and that the purported minutes dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 are fake. Importantly, no rights will be prejudiced if our client is cleared for the interview and vetting processes that will eventually determine the successful candidate.

We look forward to an amicable resolution of this matter to avert unnecessary action on the part of our client.

dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022, a date before the deadline of 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022 of submission of applications for EALA, are used to confirm that three names were purportedly deliberated and approved by the Wiper Management Committee meeting of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022.

Our client has today inspected at parliament, the applications of the so-called approved Wiper candidates and the purported signed minutes dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 of the Wiper management committee meeting and observed the following:

1. Candidate Hellen Mueni Ndeti's application to the clerks of both the National Assembly and the Senate is dated 13<sup>th</sup> October 2022 yet the advert for EALA applications was issued on the 27<sup>th</sup> of October 2022. It is ironic and suspect how Ms. Mueni could have submitted her application for EALA two (2) weeks before the advert.
2. Candidate Winfred Syonindi Mutua's application is not dated, this is irregular.
3. The minutes dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 of the Wiper management committee meeting are fake because:
  - a) the names contained therein for EALA nomination by Wiper were not discussed nor deliberated upon at the meeting;
  - b) the Wiper management committee meeting could not have deliberated on a set of names that not been forwarded to them by the Clerk of the National Assembly or Senate or by extension the Azimio coalition;
  - c) Applications for EALA were still being received at parliament since the application deadline of 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022 had not been attained;
  - d) Additionally, minutes of the Wiper management committee meeting are procedurally confirmed at the next meeting, dated by hand by the Chairperson and signed by the Chairperson and the Secretary general of the party;
  - e) The next Wiper management committee meeting, following the meeting of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 is set for today the 10<sup>th</sup> of November 2022, when the minutes of the last meeting should be tabled, dated by hand by the Chair and signed. This has not yet happened

Wiper has through the Azimio coalition by way of a letter dated 9 November 2022 from the Office of the Leader of the Minority Party addressed to yourselves, illegitimately submitted three names without the deliberation and approval of the Wiper management committee meeting as stated above. This action is illegal and is intended to circumvent the party's internal constitution to deprive our client a fair opportunity to compete and be vetted for the position.

As the National Chairman of Wiper, our client confirms that following the close of applications for EALA on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022:



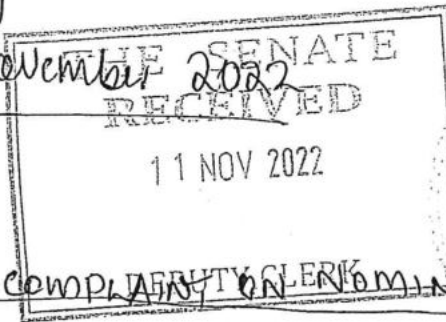

Further to the public inspection of the documents at County hall.  
I wish to point out the following anomalies, which could lead to a miscarriage of justice.

1. Hellen Mueni Ndeti purports to have made an application for their EALA nominations, in a letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> October 2022 yet the first Advert to the best of my knowledge appeared on 26<sup>th</sup> October 2022
2. Winifred S. Mutua on her part made her application in a letter dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 but indications are that it was received on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November a day after the meeting of the WDM National Management Committee meeting
3. The WDM National Management Committee meet on 1<sup>st</sup> November to make a decision, yet the deadline for application was 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022. This effectively locked out and disenfranchised any applicant who might have directly applied to the Clerk of the Senate / National Assembly.
4. I am in doubt as to the authenticity of the minutes provided by WDM. reasons whereof; knowing the Chairman as a stickler for detail, I doubt he would have signed a document with his name misspelt.

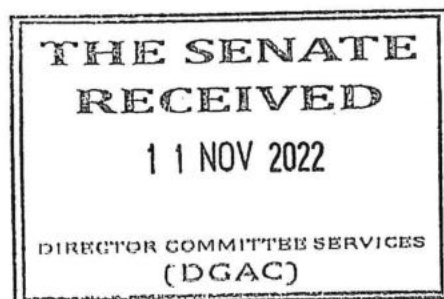

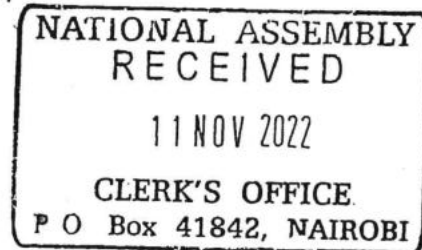
