## **INTRODUCTION**

- (1) Article 127 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 establishes a Parliamentary Service Commission with functions and responsibilities as set out in Article 127 (6) (a) to (e) and the Parliamentary Service Act. These include the following -
  - (a) providing services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of Parliament;
  - (b) constituting offices in the parliamentary service and appointing and supervising office holders;
  - (c) preparing annual estimates of expenditure of the parliamentary service and submitting them to the National Assembly for approval and basically exercising budgetary control over the service;
  - (d) undertaking programmes to promote the ideals of parliamentary democracy;
  - (e) performing other functions –
    - (i) necessary for the well-being of the members and staff of Parliament; or
    - (ii) prescribed by national legislation.
- (2) Article 127(2) and (3) of the Constitution provide that the Parliamentary Service Commission shall consist of the following Members -

*“(2) (a) the Speaker of the National Assembly, as chairperson;*  
*(b) a vice-chairperson elected by the commission from among its members*  
*(c) seven members appointed by Parliament from among its members as follows -*
  - (i) four shall be nominated equally from both Houses by the party or coalition of parties forming the national government, of who at least two shall be women; and*
  - (ii) three shall be nominated by the Parties not forming the national government, at least one of whom shall be nominated from each House and at least one shall be a woman; and**(d) one man and one woman appointed by Parliament from among persons who are experienced in public affairs but are not members of Parliament.*

*(3) The Clerk of the Senate shall be the Secretary of the Commission.”*

## **VACANCY IN THE POSITION OF MALE NON-MP COMMISSIONER**

- (3) The position of the male non-MP member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127 (2)(d) became vacant following the resignation of Hon. Samuel Chepkong'a, in April, 2022 for purposes of contesting for an elective position in the General Elections that took place on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2022.

## APPLICABLE PROCEDURE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER

- (4) The applicable procedure for the appointment of a Member of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution is provided for in the First Schedule to the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 as follows -

- “1. Upon the convening of the first sitting of Parliament pursuant to Article 126(2) of the Constitution, or whenever a vacancy arises in the membership of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution, the Secretary of the Commission shall, within fourteen days of that first sitting or the occurrence of the vacancy or within such time as would be reasonable, by notice in the Gazette and in at least two daily newspapers of national circulation, declare a vacancy and invite interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as members of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.*
- 2. Any person qualified in accordance with the Constitution may make an application to the Secretary within fourteen days of the publication of the notice.*
- 3. The Parliamentary Service Commission shall, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications under paragraph 2, consider the applications, shortlist, conduct interviews and recommend — (a) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position; and (b) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position.*
- 4. The name of a person recommended under paragraph 3 shall be submitted to the National Assembly and the Senate for approval and appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.*
- 5. If both Houses of Parliament approve a person recommended under paragraph 3, the Secretary shall, within seven days after the approval, publish the name of the person in the Gazette.*
- 6. Where one or both Houses of Parliament reject the persons recommended under paragraph 3, the Speaker of the relevant House shall communicate the decision of that House to the other House and shall request for a fresh nomination by the Commission.*
- 7. On receipt of a request by a House under paragraph 6, the Commission shall, within seven days, submit to the National Assembly and the Senate a fresh nomination from amongst the persons shortlisted by the Commission under paragraph 3.*

*8. If either or both of the Houses of Parliament reject any or all of the subsequent nominees submitted by the Commission for approval under paragraph 7, the provisions of paragraphs 1 to 6 shall apply."*

#### **INITIAL ADVERTISEMENT FOR THE POSITION OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER**

- (5) At its Special meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> March, 2022, the Parliamentary Service Commission resolved that the process for recruitment of a male Commissioner under the provisions of Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya commences with an advertisement in the Gazette and in at least two daily newspapers of national circulation calling for qualified applicants to apply.
- (6) Pursuant to the Resolution, the Secretary to the Commission, the position was initially advertised on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022 in two daily newspapers of national circulation and on the Parliament Website. The Commission subsequently considered the the applications and four candidates were shortlisted.
- (7) However, at its Special Meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2022, the Parliamentary Service Commission considered the Interview Schedule for the Position of Non-Member Male Commissioner- Parliamentary Service Commission as contained in Commission Paper No. 1503B and noted that there was need for greater diversity and a wider variety of skills amongst the shortlisted candidates. In view of this fact, the Commission resolved that the position be re-advertised.

#### **RE-ADVERTISEMENT OF THE POSITION OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER**

- (8) Pursuant to the Resolution of the Parliamentary Service Commission that the position of Non-MP Male Commissioner be re-advertised, the Clerk of the Senate/Secretary, PSC, on Friday, 21<sup>st</sup> October, 2022, published an advertisement for the vacant position of a male Non-Member Commissioner by placing a notice in the Kenya Gazette, in the two daily newspapers of national circulation and on the Parliament Website inviting interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as members of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

Interested persons were required to submit their applications within fourteen (14) days from the date of publication of the advertisement but not later than Friday, 4th November, 2022 at 5.00 p.m. Kenya time. *A copy of the Advertisement is attached as Annex I*



## **REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER**

- (9) A person is qualified to be appointed a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya and sections 8 and 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 if -
- (a) the person is not a Member of Parliament;
  - (b) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
  - (c) has at least ten years' experience in public affairs;
  - (d) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity set out in chapter 6 of the Constitution;
  - (e) the person has experience or interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of Parliamentary democracy;
  - (f) their appointment reflects the national values and principles set out in Article 10 of the Constitution; and
  - (g) their appointment represents the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.
- (10) Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 requires the Commission to, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications, consider the applications, shortlist the applications, conduct interviews and recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate, in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position and in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position for their consideration and approval.
- (11) The Commission is therefore required to submit the name of the recommended candidate to the National Assembly and the Senate for approval and appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.

## **LONG-LISTING AND SHORTLISTING OF APPLICATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER**

- (12) As at the close of the deadline, Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at 5.00 p.m., a total of one hundred and seventy (171) applications were received.
- (13) Out of the one hundred and seventy-one (171) applications long-listed, eight (8) qualified applicants were short-listed having met the requirements set out in the

Constitution and the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019. The following are the eight (8) applicants shortlisted for interview:

1. Aruma John Ekale (Mr.)
2. Chrisanthus Wamalwa Wakhungu (Hon.) (Dr.)
3. Cornelly Serem (Hon.)

5. James Elvis Omariba Ongwae (Hon.)

7. Peter Mungai Mwathi (Hon.)

- (14) The Parliamentary Service Commission published a list of the short-listed applicants on 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2022 in two local daily newspapers and invited the short-listed applicants for oral interviews that were set for 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. *A copy of the notice inviting short-listed applicants for interview is attached as Annex II.*
- (15) By a letter dated 27<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 to the Clerk of the Senate/Secretary, PSC, Hon. Dr. Chrisanthus Wamalwa Wakhungu thanked the Parliamentary Service Commission for having shortlisted him for the interviews but indicated that he was not able to attend the interview for he had chosen to forgo the position to pursue other interest. The candidates therefore did not attend the interview.
- (16) The oral interviews for the short-listed candidates were conducted on 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2022.
- (17) The Commission considered the curriculum vitae of each applicant and further scrutinized their original academic certificates and testimonials. The Commission then carried out interviews on the basis of the following areas:
  - (i) Academic qualifications;
  - (ii) Technical proficiency;
  - (iii) Leadership and public affairs; and
  - (iv) presentation skills / demeanour.

- (18) Following the interviews, the candidates scored as follows -

### **RECOMMENDATION OF THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT TO THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND THE SENATE**

- (19) Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 requires the Parliamentary Service Commission to, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications, consider the applications, shortlist the applications, conduct interviews and recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate, in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position and in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position for their consideration and approval.
- (20) At its Special Meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2022, the Parliamentary Service Commission resolved to recommend the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews to the National Assembly and the Senate for consideration and approval.
- (21) Accordingly, the Parliamentary Service Commission resolved to forward to the National Assembly and the Senate the name of Hon. Johnson Muthama as the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews for the position of the member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya for their consideration and appointment as a Commissioner in the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010. The Candidate's *curriculum vitae and testimonials are attached hereto as Annex III.*

### **RESOLUTION SOUGHT**

**The National Assembly and the Senate of the Republic of Kenya are requested to consider the contents of this report and resolve to appoint Hon. Johnson Muthama**

as a Commissioner in the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 for a term of six (6) years from the date of his swearing in.

Interested persons were required to submit their applications online, within fourteen (14) days from the date of the publication of the Advertisement and not later than Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at 5.00 p.m. Kenyan time, by mailing their application to [PSCCommissioner2022@parliament.go.ke](mailto:PSCCommissioner2022@parliament.go.ke), using the prescribed Form.

Following receipt of the applications, the Parliamentary Service Commission is required to consider the applications, shortlist, interview and recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate, the name of the suitable candidate for appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.
