A prospective bidder enquired whether it was a requirement to have a Service Level Agreement considering the fact that the contract period is for 3 years as per the Tender Document		The Committee was to seek clarification further on the issue. An appropriate response was to be availed at a later date. Upon further consultations as agreed, the prospective bidders are informed that the procuring entity will sign a contract with the lowest evaluated bidder detailing all the obligations of both parties to the contract.
