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1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Background and introduction

The Auditor-General carried out a Special Audit on the efficiency and effectiveness of Covid-19 vaccines roll-out in Kenya. The Audit covered the period from inception of the vaccination exercise in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022. The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in the Forty-Seven (47) Counties. This report however, specifically covers the portion of the audit performed for the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in Nyamira County. The audit involved review of budget, sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource financing, coordination of players, monitoring and supervision.

The Government of Kenya commissioned use of the Chanjo System to manage the Covid-19 vaccines rollout and utilized existing immunization structures for other routine vaccines.

1.2 Audit Scope, Limitations and Mitigation

The audit reviewed all processes relating to Covid-19 vaccines immunization which included budgeting, administration, and disposal of the expired stocks, governance, and monitoring structures.

Challenges experienced during the audit included low levels of staff proficiency in usage of the Chanjo System. It was also not clear to the staff which record was primary for the vaccination between the Chanjo System and manual records. The inadequacy and completeness of vaccine inventory records was also not assured. The Audit Team put in place several measures to mitigate the challenges including expanding the scope to near 100% coverage of the vaccinating facilities in the County.

1.3 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Audit exercise entailed planning, piloting of the vaccine roll-out audit in one of the counties before rolling out to the rest of the 47 Counties. Meetings were held with the auditee and the audit teams collected evidence through interviews, document reviews,

data analytics, analysis of audit evidence among others. The audit was performed using International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs).

1.4 Report Summary

1.4.1 Doses received and administered

Nyamira County received 308,000 doses of various types of vaccines during the period under review. Out of the total Covid-19 vaccine doses received in the County, 238,401 doses were administered while 7,673 vaccine doses were still in stock as at the time of the audit cutoff date on 31 March, 2022. The balance of 61,926 vaccine doses comprised of expired, damaged, wasted and unexplained deficit of 53,172 doses as at 31 March, 2022.

1.4.2 Budget

A review of the Nyamira County health services budget for the 2021/2022 financial year revealed that the County did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities but instead used the budget for routine immunization to cater for the rollout exercise.

1.4.3 Sources and Distribution of Vaccines

The source of vaccines to the County was from the Government of Kenya (GOK) through the Kisumu Regional Store.

The distribution flow was from Regional Store to the Sub County stores and to the facilities which administered the vaccines.

1.4.4 Storage of Vaccines

The Nyamira County and Sub County Stores complied to some extent with the storage conditions set out by MOH for Covid-19 Vaccines. However, weaknesses were noted in the storage at the facilities including inadequate storage equipment and temperature monitoring tools.

1.4.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 8,754 vaccine doses had expired, were damaged or had gone to waste. Out of 8,754 vaccine doses 5,184 had been disposed with other

hospital waste while the balance of 3,570 vaccine doses were kept at the County Store awaiting return to the Regional Store.

1.4.6 Human Resource Matters

The financing for health care personnel was to be funded by the Government of Kenya, Donors and development partners. Nyamira County Management explained that their trainings were undertaken through the assistance of the development partners. However, there were no proper records or documentation maintained of actual trainings that took place.

1.4.7 Coordination of players

The coordination of the exercise was done by the Nyamira County Covid-19 Vaccine Deployment and Vaccination Taskforce. This was well done especially on mobilization and vaccination outreaches.

1.4.8 Monitoring and Supervision

The Audit established that Covid-19 Vaccines roll out was monitored and supervised by a committee to ensure smooth implementation of policies and guidelines issued from time to time by the National Government. However, some facilities had no computer tablets or they were not functional, airtime was not provided and adverse effects booklets were not supplied in some facilities.

1.4.9 Conclusions and Recommendation.

The audit concluded that the roll-out of the Covid-19 Vaccines was effective. However, weaknesses were noted in some of the processes including failure to budget for the rollout activities, practical adherence to waste disposal regulations, inadequate staff and training at the facilities, inadequate access to the Chanjo System due to lack of data bundles to the staff updating information in the system and the system having challenges in the way it is configured and downtime. This impacted on the real time recording of information in the Chanjo System and resulted to an unexplained deficit variance of 53,172 doses valued at Kshs 29,059,638 based on the average vaccine cost during the period.

The existing immunization structures for routine vaccines were functional but require scale up to handle unforeseen pandemics. Owing to the weaknesses noted it is recommended that the Nyamira County Government should work closely with National Government to strengthen the existing immunization structures and staffing to meet international standards.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

Kenya received its first consignment of Oxford/AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine in March 2021 as part of the COVAX facility. This was followed by more vaccines of Moderna, Johnson & Johnson (Janssen), Pfizer and Sinopharm from other development partners. The Ministry of Health (MOH) launched a campaign and kicked off the deployment plan for the Covid-19 vaccines roll out on 5 March 2021 with priority being given to frontline health workers and essential staff including security personnel. According to the National Covid-19 vaccine deployment plan, the first vaccine plan was developed in March 2021, and was subsequently revised by the MOH in August 2021 in an effort to cover the entire adult population in the country.

Nyamira County received its first consignment of 3,000 Astra Zeneca-Oxford Covid-19 vaccines in March 2021, through the Kisumu Regional Vaccines Store. The vaccine doses were first administered at Nyamira County Referral Hospital before being rolled out to the facilities in the Five (5) Sub Counties. As of 31 March 2022, the special Audit Team established that the County had received 308,000 vaccines doses as tabulated below:

2.1 Objective of the Audit

The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in Nyamira County. This was achieved through; review of budget,

sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource, and coordination of players, monitoring and supervision.

2.2 Terms of Reference

The following Terms of Reference (TORs) guided the special audit;

2.3 Scope of the Audit and Limitations

2.3.1 Scope

The audit reviewed all processes from the inception of Covid-19 vaccines roll out, through budgeting to administration and disposal including the governance and monitoring structures. The period covered was from inception in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022.

2.3.2 Limitations

The special audit experienced challenges and limitations which were mitigated in several ways in order not to negatively affect the quality and results of the audit findings. Some of the challenges and measures taken included:

- i. 17 out of 87 vaccinating facilities in Nyamira County were not defined in the Chanjo Kenya System; This called for 100% coverage physical verification of records, stocks and visits to all facilities.
- ii. It was not clear to the staff which system was the primary record for the vaccination between the Chanjo System and the manual records; This also called for examining both records to establish gaps and reconcile the two.
- iii. Accuracy and completeness of inventory records. The Audit Team corroborated information in the physical records such as order sheets and vaccines stock ledgers with information in the Chanjo System. The Audit Team had to also use the data from the forms used for vaccines receipts, utilization and balances at the individual facility while reconciling it with the Chanjo System.
- iv. Challenges in identifying errors in the system, such as reversals done long after the original error entry was made. Engaged the help of the stores in-charge and manual records in trying to establish the errors and reconcile them to the Chanjo System data.
- v. Facilities sharing user rights without proper linkages being defined. The audit team was guided by the stores in-charge and tracked vaccines to sources.

The Audit Team had to also use the data from the forms used for vaccine receipts, utilization and balances at the individual facilities while reconciling them with the Chanjo System.

2.4 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Special Audit Team held entry and exit meetings with the County Health Management team on 9 May, 2022 and 2 June 2022, respectively. The Audit Team held planning meeting before the commencement of the exercise. During the entry meeting, the management were taken through the detailed plan and which the meeting adopted and was applied in the execution of the audit. The following were the main evidence gathering methods applied during the audit execution:

2.4.1 Document Review

To effectively plan for the audit and as a source of audit evidence, the Audit Team reviewed various documents including the vaccine order sheets, vaccine stock ledgers, various training reports, outreaches, co-ordination activities and seizure/destruction forms.

2.4.2 Analytical Review

The Audit Team extracted the vaccine data from the Chanjo System and carried out comparative analysis with records at the Regional Stores and vaccinating facilities.

2.4.3 Physical Verification

The Audit Team carried out physical verifications in the five (5) Sub County stores and the 87 vaccinating facilities in the County as detailed in **Appendix 1**.

2.4.4 Interviews

The Audit Team interviewed senior officers from Nyamira County Government to clarify the various issues to assist in making an informed report as detailed in **Table 2** below.

2.5 Audit Phases

The audit was divided into Two Phases; Phase One involved review of processes at The National Treasury, Office of the Controller of Budget and the Ministry of Health. It also involved analysis of data maintained in eIMIS, Chanjo System and Kenya Health Information System. The information was then shared with the Audit Teams to inform the next audit phase.

Phase two involved review of processes, data and verifications at Nyamira County Store, Sub County Stores and the vaccinating facilities in the County. This Phase also involved verification and interview of staff.

2.6 Report Structure

The report should be read in its entirety in order to comprehend fully the approach to and findings of our work. The report has covered analysis and facts as understood with the aim of informing The National Treasury and the Ministry of Health of the status of the Vaccines Roll Out in the County bearing in mind the challenges and limitations experienced.

3.0 DETAILED FINDINGS

3.1 Budget and Sources of Vaccines

3.1.1 Unconfirmed Funding of Covid-19 Vaccination Activities

A review of the County's health services budget for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that the County did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities. Covid-19 vaccination costs, including transportation, training and capacity building and procurement of auxiliary services such as syringes and safety boxes, could not, therefore, be traced to a specific budget, an indication that they were not budgeted for. This was contrary to Regulations 29. (1) of the Public Finance Management (County Governments) Regulations, 2015 which require the accounting officer to ensure draft estimates relating to her or his department are prepared in conformity with the Constitution, the Act and these Regulations. Management however, explained that the expenditures were met by the National Government and Donor Partners, but this was not fully supported by documentary evidence such as agreements with the Partners.

3.2 Sources of Vaccines

The County received 308,000 vaccines between March 2021 and 31 March 2022 from the National Government. A review of the County's Health Services Budget for the 2021/2022 financial year revealed that there were no provisions for the Covid-19 vaccine roll out. Further, the Special Audit revealed anomalies in budgeting and Expenditure of Covid-19 as summarized in **Table 3** below and detailed in **Appendix 2**:

3.3 Storage of Vaccines

According to World Health Organization (WHO) Guidelines (Covid-19 vaccination: supply and logistics guidance, 12 February 2021) the Covid-19 vaccines should be stored as follows:

- i. Pfizer should be maintained at -80 °C to -60 °C in Ultra Low Temperatures (ULT) freezer, and for Undiluted thawed vaccine at +2 °C to +8 °C
- ii. Moderna should be maintained at -25 °C to -15 °C in ULT freezer, and unopened vials can be stored refrigerated between 2 °C to 8 °C for up to 30 days prior to first use.
- iii. Oxford/AstraZeneca should be maintained at 2 °C to 8 °C
- iv. Further, Centre for Disease Control (CDC) clinical guidance for Janssen Covid-19 Vaccine recommend storing of the vaccine at temperatures between 2°C and 8°C.

The storage conditions applied to the Regional, Sub- County and Facility Stores. However, visits to the stores revealed that the five Sub County stores did not have cleaning logs that must be completed, signed, and checked by the appropriately designated person and a written procedure and a program for pest control. The Audit also established that 44 facilities did not adhere to the broken or damaged items guideline which requires the items to be withdrawn from usable stock and stored separately.

3.3.1 Storage at the County and Sub- Counties Stores

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verification carried out at the 5 Sub County stores revealed issues as summarized below in **Table 5** and detailed in **Appendix 3**.

From the foregoing, the special audit team confirmed that except for the lack of completed logs, written procedure and program for pest control, the County stores and the five Sub County Stores complied with storage conditions as per the WHO and Covid-19 vaccines manufacturer's storage recommendations.

3.3.2 Storage at the Facilities Level

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verifications carried out at the 87 facilities revealed issues as summarized in **Table 6** below and detailed in **Appendix 4**.

In view of the above, the Special Audit Team confirmed that a significant number of the vaccinating facilities did not separate store broken or damaged items from the usable stock. Additionally, they did not have written procedures on sanitation, pest control and clean-up of spillage. They also failed to maintain the cleaning logs.

3.3 Distribution of Vaccines

3.3.1 Distribution at County Level

Documents provided for audit revealed that Covid-19 Vaccines on arriving in the Country ideally should be transferred to the Central Stores where they are distributed to the Regional Stores. The Regional Stores then distribute to the County Stores, which in turn distribute to Sub County Stores and Sub County to Facilities. This was largely adhered to in Nyamira County except where facilities were not defined in the Chanjo System which received their vaccines through other defined facilities.

The 308,000 vaccines received in Nyamira County as at 31 March, 2022 were distributed as summarized in **Table 7** below and detailed in **Appendix 5**.

The Sub County EPI Store Coordinator indicated that vaccines that remained undistributed at the County Store were for Nyamira South Sub County, hence the conclusion that all the vaccines received at the County were distributed to Sub Counties.

According to the National Policy Guidelines on Immunization, 2013, storage and transportation of vaccines and diluents, at all stages of vaccine transportation, a cold chain monitor must always accompany all vaccines whether in cold boxes, vaccine carriers or portable fridges and the temperature reading must be maintained between +2°C and +8°C including age of conditioned ice packs. Diluents need not be transported at +2°C to +8°C unless they are being transported for outreach activities.

The special audit revealed that the 5 Sub County stores and the 87 vaccinating facilities monitored temperature during transportation of vaccines as per the guidelines.

3.4 Utilization of Vaccines

Ordinarily, Covid-19 vaccines flow through four levels before being administered; National Vaccine Store (NVS), Regional Vaccine Stores (RVS), Sub County Vaccine Stores (SCVs) and Health Facilities. Utilization of vaccines including Covid-19 vaccines takes place at a vaccinating facility.

Examination of records maintained in the Chanjo System revealed that as at 31 March, 2022, 308,000 vaccine doses had been received in the County.

Documents provided for audit revealed that there were 87 vaccinating facilities, with 70 facilities having been mapped in the Chanjo System.

Out of the total 308,000 Covid- 19 Vaccine doses received, 238,401 doses were administered, 7,673 were still in stock while the balance of 8,754 was either expired, damaged or had gone to waste as at 31 March, 2022 as summarized below in **Table 8** and detailed in **Appendix 6**. There was however an unexplained variance of 53,172 vaccine doses valued at Kshs.29,059,638.

3.4.1 Administered Doses

The Chanjo System indicates that a total of 238,401 doses had been administered in the County Nyamira from 01 March, 2021 to 31 March, 2022. The vaccine doses administered are as summarised in **Table 9** below.

3.4.2 Expired Doses

These are doses that had not been administered by the manufacturers' use by date indicated on the vials totalling to 3,570 doses which had not been disposed off by the time of the special audit. Expired doses from the facilities were reported to have been sent to Sub County Stores which in turn transported them to the County Store.

3.4.3 Damaged Doses

These were vaccines that were not administered as they had been damaged. All the 216 damaged vaccine doses recorded by the County had been disposed-off by the time of the special audit in May 2022.

3.4.4 Wasted Doses

These were vaccines that were not administered due to failure to utilize them within stipulated timelines upon opening of the vial. 4,968 vaccine doses were reported as wasted in the County and had been disposed-off by the time of the special audit in May 2022.

3.4.5 Unexplained Vaccine Variances

Documents provided for audit revealed that 308,000 vaccine doses were received in the County. However, reconciliation of the vaccines received, administered, in stock, expired, damaged and wasted revealed an unexplained variance of 53,172 doses valued at Kshs.29,059,638.

The following weakness observed during the audit could have contributed to the unexplained variance:

- i. Wastages not reported at the facilities,

- ii. vaccines doses utilized during the outreaches or in facilities not defined in the Chanjo System may not have been subsequently updated,
- iii. Vaccination data was not entered accurately, causing over-administration in some batches and under-administration in others, and
- iv. Extended system downtime occasioning delay or failure to upload data.

3.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 3,570 expired doses had not been disposed-off as at the time of audit. However, 5,184 damaged and wasted doses had been disposed-off.

A review of documents provided for audit revealed non-compliance with the disposal requirements as per Section 6.1 of the WHO Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) on waste management of Covid-19 vaccines vials and ancillary supplies. The procedure states that any used or discarded Covid-19 vaccine vials MUST be collected safely and separately from the rest of the waste. Both the empty vials and those with remaining vaccine doses discarded at the end of the daily vaccination activity shall be collected and safely stored until they are collected for final treatment and disposal. These vials should be counted and recorded by the responsible team for the purpose of vaccination activity analysis (e.g. utilization, coverage, wastage, etc.). Further, Section 6.6 provides that neutralized Covid-19 vaccine vials can be safely disposed in a manner that is not accessible or reusable, and neither being an environmental nor a health threat. The findings on disposal of vaccines are as summarized below in Table 9 and detailed in Appendices 7 & 8.

The disposal of the unused or discarded vaccines did not comply with the WHO Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) on waste management of Covid-19 vaccines vials and ancillary supplies because there was no budget and waste management plan in majority of the Sub-County stores and facilities. Consequently, the undisposed expired vaccines, the unused or discarded vaccines may pose a health risk to the general public and the health officers.

3.6 Human Resource Matters

Training at County Level

The health care workers were to be trained and were required to be competent on; knowledge on Covid-19 disease; knowledge and skills in Covid-19 Vaccine demand creation, health facility preparation, safe vaccine administration, infection control practices, patient data management, adverse event reporting and management, documentation and monitoring of vaccine utilization and logistics, communication, waste management, mental health and multi-disciplinary team work.

Immediately after the Covid-19 vaccines were rolled out, trainings for different levels of personnel in the National and County Governments were conducted. Nyamira County Health Management team indicated that trainings in all the five (5) Sub Counties were undertaken through the support of the National Government and Partners. However, other than the schedules and correspondences showing the donor funding, no partnership

agreements and documentation to support the National Government funding was provided for review.

The County and Sub Counties provided supporting documentation including the training plan, training timetable, venue, and the attendance lists.

A review of the documents provided for audit revealed anomalies as summarized below and detailed in **Appendices 9 and 10**

In the foregoing, the Special Audit Team could not establish the adequacy of Human Resources engagement in the Covid-19 vaccines roll out programme.

3.7 Coordination of players

Coordination at County Level

According to the National Covid-19 Vaccine Deployment Plan 2021, the County Emergency Covid-19 Response Committee were to be adopted to form the Steering Committee. A review of documents provided for audit at the County, Sub- Counties and Facilities revealed anomalies as summarized below and detailed in **Appendices 11, 12 and 13**

From the foregoing, only two facilities failed to carry out mobilization and outreaches which may not have adversely affected the vaccination exercise.

3.8 Monitoring and Supervision

A review of documents provided for audit at the various levels of Covid-19 management revealed anomalies as summarized in Table 12 below and detailed in Appendices 14, 15 and 16

In view of the above, of the 87 facilities, 75 facilities had received tablets from the MOH for use in the recording of vaccine receipts and administration. 59 of the 75 facilities that had received the tablets, reported their tablets being functional and in use while 18 were not in good working condition. Further, 5 facilities did not have adverse effects booklets for reporting the adverse occurrences.

Consequently, the facilities were not fully supported to record the receipts and administration of vaccines and monitor adverse effects.

4.0 IRREGULARITIES AND WEAKNESSES IN MANAGEMENT AND CONTROLS OF VACCINES IN INSTITUTIONS

4.1 Irregularities and Weaknesses at the County and Sub County Level

The following irregularities and weaknesses and the corresponding recommendations were observed by the special audit at the Nyamira County and Sub County levels

5.0 CONCLUSION

The objective of the special audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccine roll out in Nyamira County. Following the findings, the County should ensure that all vaccinating facilities are defined in the Chanjo System and effective supervision of the activities at the County, Sub County and facilities on all matters relating to receipts, issues and utilization of vaccines. The above weaknesses resulted in an unexplained deficit variance of 53,172 of vaccine doses valued at Kshs 29,059,638 based on the average Vaccine cost during the period.

The County should also adhere to the cold chain and supply logistics guidelines as issued by WHO and MOH. In order to meet the increasing service demands, there is need to continuously assess demand for health workers and build their capacity for effective service delivery to the citizens of Nyamira County.



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1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Background and introduction

The Auditor-General carried out a Special Audit on the efficiency and effectiveness of Covid-19 vaccines roll-out in Kenya. The Audit covered the period from inception of the vaccination exercise in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022. The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in the Forty-Seven (47) Counties. This report however, specifically covers the portion of the audit performed for the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in Nyamira County. The audit involved review of budget, sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource financing, coordination of players, monitoring and supervision.

The Government of Kenya commissioned use of the Chanjo System to manage the Covid-19 vaccines rollout and utilized existing immunization structures for other routine vaccines.

1.2 Audit Scope, Limitations and Mitigation

The audit reviewed all processes relating to Covid-19 vaccines immunization which included budgeting, administration, and disposal of the expired stocks, governance, and monitoring structures.

Challenges experienced during the audit included low levels of staff proficiency in usage of the Chanjo System. It was also not clear to the staff which record was primary for the vaccination between the Chanjo System and manual records. The inadequacy and completeness of vaccine inventory records was also not assured. The Audit Team put in place several measures to mitigate the challenges including expanding the scope to near 100% coverage of the vaccinating facilities in the County.

1.3 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Audit exercise entailed planning, piloting of the vaccine roll-out audit in one of the counties before rolling out to the rest of the 47 Counties. Meetings were held with the auditee and the audit teams collected evidence through interviews, document reviews,

data analytics, analysis of audit evidence among others. The audit was performed using International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs).

1.4 Report Summary

1.4.1 Doses received and administered

Nyamira County received 308,000 doses of various types of vaccines during the period under review. Out of the total Covid-19 vaccine doses received in the County, 238,401 doses were administered while 7,673 vaccine doses were still in stock as at the time of the audit cutoff date on 31 March, 2022. The balance of 61,926 vaccine doses comprised of expired, damaged, wasted and unexplained deficit of 53,172 doses as at 31 March, 2022.

1.4.2 Budget

A review of the Nyamira County health services budget for the 2021/2022 financial year revealed that the County did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities but instead used the budget for routine immunization to cater for the rollout exercise.

1.4.3 Sources and Distribution of Vaccines

The source of vaccines to the County was from the Government of Kenya (GOK) through the Kisumu Regional Store.

The distribution flow was from Regional Store to the Sub County stores and to the facilities which administered the vaccines.

1.4.4 Storage of Vaccines

The Nyamira County and Sub County Stores complied to some extent with the storage conditions set out by MOH for Covid-19 Vaccines. However, weaknesses were noted in the storage at the facilities including inadequate storage equipment and temperature monitoring tools.

1.4.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 8,754 vaccine doses had expired, were damaged or had gone to waste. Out of 8,754 vaccine doses 5,184 had been disposed with other

hospital waste while the balance of 3,570 vaccine doses were kept at the County Store awaiting return to the Regional Store.

1.4.6 Human Resource Matters

The financing for health care personnel was to be funded by the Government of Kenya, Donors and development partners. Nyamira County Management explained that their trainings were undertaken through the assistance of the development partners. However, there were no proper records or documentation maintained of actual trainings that took place.

1.4.7 Coordination of players

The coordination of the exercise was done by the Nyamira County Covid-19 Vaccine Deployment and Vaccination Taskforce. This was well done especially on mobilization and vaccination outreaches.

1.4.8 Monitoring and Supervision

The Audit established that Covid-19 Vaccines roll out was monitored and supervised by a committee to ensure smooth implementation of policies and guidelines issued from time to time by the National Government. However, some facilities had no computer tablets or they were not functional, airtime was not provided and adverse effects booklets were not supplied in some facilities.

1.4.9 Conclusions and Recommendation.

The audit concluded that the roll-out of the Covid-19 Vaccines was effective. However, weaknesses were noted in some of the processes including failure to budget for the rollout activities, practical adherence to waste disposal regulations, inadequate staff and training at the facilities, inadequate access to the Chanjo System due to lack of data bundles to the staff updating information in the system and the system having challenges in the way it is configured and downtime. This impacted on the real time recording of information in the Chanjo System and resulted to an unexplained deficit variance of 53,172 doses valued at Kshs 29,059,638 based on the average vaccine cost during the period.

The existing immunization structures for routine vaccines were functional but require scale up to handle unforeseen pandemics. Owing to the weaknesses noted it is recommended that the Nyamira County Government should work closely with National Government to strengthen the existing immunization structures and staffing to meet international standards.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

Kenya received its first consignment of Oxford/AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine in March 2021 as part of the COVAX facility. This was followed by more vaccines of Moderna, Johnson & Johnson (Janssen), Pfizer and Sinopharm from other development partners. The Ministry of Health (MOH) launched a campaign and kicked off the deployment plan for the Covid-19 vaccines roll out on 5 March 2021 with priority being given to frontline health workers and essential staff including security personnel. According to the National Covid-19 vaccine deployment plan, the first vaccine plan was developed in March 2021, and was subsequently revised by the MOH in August 2021 in an effort to cover the entire adult population in the country.

Nyamira County received its first consignment of 3,000 Astra Zeneca-Oxford Covid-19 vaccines in March 2021, through the Kisumu Regional Vaccines Store. The vaccine doses were first administered at Nyamira County Referral Hospital before being rolled out to the facilities in the Five (5) Sub Counties. As of 31 March 2022, the special Audit Team established that the County had received 308,000 vaccines doses as tabulated below:

2.1 Objective of the Audit

The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in Nyamira County. This was achieved through; review of budget,

sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource, and coordination of players, monitoring and supervision.

2.3 Scope of the Audit and Limitations

2.3.1 Scope

The audit reviewed all processes from the inception of Covid-19 vaccines roll out, through budgeting to administration and disposal including the governance and monitoring structures. The period covered was from inception in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022.

2.3.2 Limitations

The special audit experienced challenges and limitations which were mitigated in several ways in order not to negatively affect the quality and results of the audit findings. Some of the challenges and measures taken included:

- i. 17 out of 87 vaccinating facilities in Nyamira County were not defined in the Chanjo Kenya System; This called for 100% coverage physical verification of records, stocks and visits to all facilities.
- ii. It was not clear to the staff which system was the primary record for the vaccination between the Chanjo System and the manual records; This also called for examining both records to establish gaps and reconcile the two.
- iii. Accuracy and completeness of inventory records. The Audit Team corroborated information in the physical records such as order sheets and vaccines stock ledgers with information in the Chanjo System. The Audit Team had to also use the data from the forms used for vaccines receipts, utilization and balances at the individual facility while reconciling it with the Chanjo System.
- iv. Challenges in identifying errors in the system, such as reversals done long after the original error entry was made. Engaged the help of the stores in-charge and manual records in trying to establish the errors and reconcile them to the Chanjo System data.
- v. Facilities sharing user rights without proper linkages being defined. The audit team was guided by the stores in-charge and tracked vaccines to sources.

The Audit Team had to also use the data from the forms used for vaccine receipts, utilization and balances at the individual facilities while reconciling them with the Chanjo System.

2.4 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Special Audit Team held entry and exit meetings with the County Health Management team on 9 May, 2022 and 2 June 2022, respectively. The Audit Team held planning meeting before the commencement of the exercise. During the entry meeting, the management were taken through the detailed plan and which the meeting adopted and was applied in the execution of the audit. The following were the main evidence gathering methods applied during the audit execution:

2.4.1 Document Review

To effectively plan for the audit and as a source of audit evidence, the Audit Team reviewed various documents including the vaccine order sheets, vaccine stock ledgers, various training reports, outreaches, co-ordination activities and seizure/destruction forms.

2.4.2 Analytical Review

The Audit Team extracted the vaccine data from the Chanjo System and carried out comparative analysis with records at the Regional Stores and vaccinating facilities.

2.4.3 Physical Verification

The Audit Team carried out physical verifications in the five (5) Sub County stores and the 87 vaccinating facilities in the County as detailed in **Appendix 1**.

2.4.4 Interviews

The Audit Team interviewed senior officers from Nyamira County Government to clarify the various issues to assist in making an informed report as detailed in **Table 2** below.

The audit was divided into Two Phases; Phase One involved review of processes at The National Treasury, Office of the Controller of Budget and the Ministry of Health. It also involved analysis of data maintained in eLMIS, Chanjo System and Kenya Health Information System. The information was then shared with the Audit Teams to inform the next audit phase.

Phase two involved review of processes, data and verifications at Nyamira County Store, Sub County Stores and the vaccinating facilities in the County. This Phase also involved verification and interview of staff.

The report has covered analysis and facts as understood with the aim of informing The National Treasury and the Ministry of Health of the status of the Vaccines Roll Out in the County bearing in mind the challenges and limitations experienced.

3.0 DETAILED FINDINGS

3.1 Budget and Sources of Vaccines

3.1.1 Unconfirmed Funding of Covid-19 Vaccination Activities

A review of the County's health services budget for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that the County did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities. Covid-19 vaccination costs, including transportation, training and capacity building and procurement of auxiliary services such as syringes and safety boxes, could not, therefore, be traced to a specific budget, an indication that they were not budgeted for. This was contrary to Regulations 29. (1) of the Public Finance Management (County Governments) Regulations, 2015 which require the accounting officer to ensure draft estimates relating to her or his department are prepared in conformity with the Constitution, the Act and these Regulations. Management however, explained that the expenditures were met by the National Government and Donor Partners, but this was not fully supported by documentary evidence such as agreements with the Partners.

3.2 Sources of Vaccines

The County received 308,000 vaccines between March 2021 and 31 March 2022 from the National Government. A review of the County's Health Services Budget for the 2021/2022 financial year revealed that there were no provisions for the Covid-19 vaccine roll out. Further, the Special Audit revealed anomalies in budgeting and Expenditure of Covid-19 as summarized in **Table 3** below and detailed in **Appendix 2**:

3.3 Storage of Vaccines

According to World Health Organization (WHO) Guidelines (Covid-19 vaccination: supply and logistics guidance, 12 February 2021) the Covid-19 vaccines should be stored as follows:

- i. Pfizer should be maintained at -80 °C to -60 °C in Ultra Low Temperatures (ULT) freezer, and for Undiluted thawed vaccine at +2 °C to +8 °C
- ii. Moderna should be maintained at -25 °C to -15 °C in ULT freezer, and unopened vials can be stored refrigerated between 2 °C to 8 °C for up to 30 days prior to first use.
- iii. Oxford/AstraZeneca should be maintained at 2 °C to 8 °C
- iv. Further, Centre for Disease Control (CDC) clinical guidance for Janssen Covid-19 Vaccine recommend storing of the vaccine at temperatures between 2°C and 8°C.

The storage conditions applied to the Regional, Sub- County and Facility Stores. However, visits to the stores revealed that the five Sub County stores did not have cleaning logs that must be completed, signed, and checked by the appropriately designated person and a written procedure and a program for pest control. The Audit also established that 44 facilities did not adhere to the broken or damaged items guideline which requires the items to be withdrawn from usable stock and stored separately.

3.3.1 Storage at the County and Sub- Counties Stores

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verification carried out at the 5 Sub County stores revealed issues as summarized below in **Table 5** and detailed in **Appendix 3**.

From the foregoing, the special audit team confirmed that except for the lack of completed logs, written procedure and program for pest control, the County stores and the five Sub County Stores complied with storage conditions as per the WHO and Covid-19 vaccines manufacturer's storage recommendations.

3.3.2 Storage at the Facilities Level

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verifications carried out at the 87 facilities revealed issues as summarized in **Table 6** below and detailed in **Appendix 4**.

In view of the above, the Special Audit Team confirmed that a significant number of the vaccinating facilities did not separate store broken or damaged items from the usable stock. Additionally, they did not have written procedures on sanitation, pest control and clean-up of spillage. They also failed to maintain the cleaning logs.

3.3 Distribution of Vaccines

3.3.1 Distribution at County Level

Documents provided for audit revealed that Covid-19 Vaccines on arriving in the Country ideally should be transferred to the Central Stores where they are distributed to the Regional Stores. The Regional Stores then distribute to the County Stores, which in turn distribute to Sub County Stores and Sub County to Facilities. This was largely adhered to in Nyamira County except where facilities were not defined in the Chanjo System which received their vaccines through other defined facilities.

The 308,000 vaccines received in Nyamira County as at 31 March, 2022 were distributed as summarized in **Table 7** below and detailed in **Appendix 5**.

The Sub County EPI Store Coordinator indicated that vaccines that remained undistributed at the County Store were for Nyamira South Sub County, hence the conclusion that all the vaccines received at the County were distributed to Sub Counties.

According to the National Policy Guidelines on Immunization, 2013, storage and transportation of vaccines and diluents, at all stages of vaccine transportation, a cold chain monitor must always accompany all vaccines whether in cold boxes, vaccine carriers or portable fridges and the temperature reading must be maintained between +2°C and +8°C including age of conditioned ice packs. Diluents need not be transported at +2°C to +8°C unless they are being transported for outreach activities.

The special audit revealed that the 5 Sub County stores and the 87 vaccinating facilities monitored temperature during transportation of vaccines as per the guidelines.

3.4 Utilization of Vaccines

Ordinarily, Covid-19 vaccines flow through four levels before being administered; National Vaccine Store (NVS), Regional Vaccine Stores (RVS), Sub County Vaccine Stores (SCVs) and Health Facilities. Utilization of vaccines including Covid-19 vaccines takes place at a vaccinating facility.

Examination of records maintained in the Chanjo System revealed that as at 31 March, 2022, 308,000 vaccine doses had been received in the County.

Documents provided for audit revealed that there were 87 vaccinating facilities, with 70 facilities having been mapped in the Chanjo System.

Out of the total 308,000 Covid- 19 Vaccine doses received, 238,401 doses were administered, 7,673 were still in stock while the balance of 8,754 was either expired, damaged or had gone to waste as at 31 March, 2022 as summarized below in **Table 8** and detailed in **Appendix 6**. There was however an unexplained variance of 53,172 vaccine doses valued at Kshs.29,059,638.

3.4.1 Administered Doses

The Chanjo System indicates that a total of 238,401 doses had been administered in the County Nyamira from 01 March, 2021 to 31 March, 2022. The vaccine doses administered are as summarised in **Table 9** below.

3.4.2 Expired Doses

These are doses that had not been administered by the manufacturers' use by date indicated on the vials totalling to 3,570 doses which had not been disposed off by the time of the special audit. Expired doses from the facilities were reported to have been sent to Sub County Stores which in turn transported them to the County Store.

3.4.3 Damaged Doses

These were vaccines that were not administered as they had been damaged. All the 216 damaged vaccine doses recorded by the County had been disposed-off by the time of the special audit in May 2022.

3.4.4 Wasted Doses

These were vaccines that were not administered due to failure to utilize them within stipulated timelines upon opening of the vial. 4,968 vaccine doses were reported as wasted in the County and had been disposed-off by the time of the special audit in May 2022.

3.4.5 Unexplained Vaccine Variances

Documents provided for audit revealed that 308,000 vaccine doses were received in the County. However, reconciliation of the vaccines received, administered, in stock, expired, damaged and wasted revealed an unexplained variance of 53,172 doses valued at Kshs.29,059,638.

The following weakness observed during the audit could have contributed to the unexplained variance:

- i. Wastages not reported at the facilities,

- ii. vaccines doses utilized during the outreaches or in facilities not defined in the Chanjo System may not have been subsequently updated,
- iii. Vaccination data was not entered accurately, causing over-administration in some batches and under-administration in others, and
- iv. Extended system downtime occasioning delay or failure to upload data.

3.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 3,570 expired doses had not been disposed-off as at the time of audit. However, 5,184 damaged and wasted doses had been disposed-off.

A review of documents provided for audit revealed non-compliance with the disposal requirements as per Section 6.1 of the WHO Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) on waste management of Covid -19 vaccines vials and ancillary supplies. The procedure states that any used or discarded Covid-19 vaccine vials MUST be collected safely and separately from the rest of the waste. Both the empty vials and those with remaining vaccine doses discarded at the end of the daily vaccination activity shall be collected and safely stored until they are collected for final treatment and disposal. These vials should be counted and recorded by the responsible team for the purpose of vaccination activity analysis (e.g. utilization, coverage, wastage, etc.). Further, Section 6.6 provides that neutralized Covid-19 vaccine vials can be safely disposed in a manner that is not accessible or reusable, and neither being an environmental nor a health threat. The findings on disposal of vaccines are as summarized below in Table 9 and detailed in **Appendices 7 & 8**.

The disposal of the unused or discarded vaccines did not comply with the WHO Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) on waste management of Covid-19 vaccines vials and ancillary supplies because there was no budget and waste management plan in majority of the Sub-County stores and facilities. Consequently, the undisposed expired vaccines, the unused or discarded vaccines may pose a health risk to the general public and the health officers.

3.6 Human Resource Matters

Training at County Level

The health care workers were to be trained and were required to be competent on; knowledge on Covid-19 disease; knowledge and skills in Covid-19 Vaccine demand creation, health facility preparation, safe vaccine administration, infection control practices, patient data management, adverse event reporting and management, documentation and monitoring of vaccine utilization and logistics, communication, waste management, mental health and multi-disciplinary team work.

Immediately after the Covid-19 vaccines were rolled out, trainings for different levels of personnel in the National and County Governments were conducted. Nyamira County Health Management team indicated that trainings in all the five (5) Sub Counties were undertaken through the support of the National Government and Partners. However, other than the schedules and correspondences showing the donor funding, no partnership

agreements and documentation to support the National Government funding was provided for review.

The County and Sub Counties provided supporting documentation including the training plan, training timetable, venue, and the attendance lists.

A review of the documents provided for audit revealed anomalies as summarized below and detailed in **Appendices 9 and 10**

In the foregoing, the Special Audit Team could not establish the adequacy of Human Resources engagement in the Covid-19 vaccines roll out programme.

3.7 Coordination of players

Coordination at County Level

According to the National Covid-19 Vaccine Deployment Plan 2021, the County Emergency Covid-19 Response Committee were to be adopted to form the Steering Committee. A review of documents provided for audit at the County, Sub- Counties and Facilities revealed anomalies as summarized below and detailed in **Appendices 11, 12 and 13**

From the foregoing, only two facilities failed to carry out mobilization and outreaches which may not have adversely affected the vaccination exercise.

3.8 Monitoring and Supervision

In view of the above, of the 87 facilities, 75 facilities had received tablets from the MOH for use in the recording of vaccine receipts and administration. 59 of the 75 facilities that had received the tablets, reported their tablets being functional and in use while 18 were not in good working condition. Further, 5 facilities did not have adverse effects booklets for reporting the adverse occurrences.

Consequently, the facilities were not fully supported to record the receipts and administration of vaccines and monitor adverse effects.

4.0 IRREGULARITIES AND WEAKNESSES IN MANAGEMENT AND CONTROLS OF VACCINES IN INSTITUTIONS

4.1 Irregularities and Weaknesses at the County and Sub County Level

The following irregularities and weaknesses and the corresponding recommendations were observed by the special audit at the Nyamira County and Sub County levels

5.0 CONCLUSION

The objective of the special audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccine roll out in Nyamira County. Following the findings, the County should ensure that all vaccinating facilities are defined in the Chanjo System and effective supervision of the activities at the County, Sub County and facilities on all matters relating to receipts, issues and utilization of vaccines. The above weaknesses resulted in an unexplained deficit variance of 53,172 of vaccine doses valued at Kshs 29,059,638 based on the average Vaccine cost during the period.

The County should also adhere to the cold chain and supply logistics guidelines as issued by WHO and MOH. In order to meet the increasing service demands, there is need to continuously assess demand for health workers and build their capacity for effective service delivery to the citizens of Nyamira County.
