CLAUSE 2

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 2 and substituting therefor the following new clause—

“2. The Investment Promotion Act is amended by deleting the heading “PART II—INVESTMENT CERTIFICATES—APPLICATION AND ISSUE, ETC” appearing immediately after section 2 and substituting therefor the following new heading—
“PART II—REGISTRATION OF FOREIGN INVESTMENTS”

CLAUSE 3

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 3.

CLAUSE 4

THAT, clause 4 of the Bill be amended—

- (a) in the proposed section 4 (1) by deleting the word “direct” appearing immediately after the word “foreign”.
- (b) by deleting the proposed section 4(2) and substituting therefor the following new provision—
 - (2) A foreign investor shall apply for registration of a foreign investment in the prescribed form.

CLAUSE 5

THAT, clause 5 of the Bill be amended—

- (a) in the proposed new section 6(1) by deleting the word “direct” appearing immediately after the word “foreign”; and
- (b) by deleting the proposed section 6(2) and substituting therefor the following new provisions—

(2) In determining whether an investment and any activity related to the investment are beneficial to Kenya for the purposes of subsection (1)(c), the Authority shall consider the extent to which the investment or activity will contribute to the conditions specified in paragraphs (a), (b) (c), (d) and (e) and any or all of the conditions specified in paragraphs (f), (g) and (h)—

- (a) creation of employment for Kenyans;
- (b) acquisition of new skills or modern compatible state of the art technology for Kenyans;
- (c) contribution to tax revenues or other Government revenues;
- (d) utilization of domestic raw materials, supplies and services if available and can meet the required standards;
- (e) adoption of necessary value addition in the processing of local, natural and agricultural resources;
- (f) transfer of technology to Kenya;
- (g) an increase in foreign exchange, either through exports or import substitution; and
- (h) utilization, promotion, development and implementation of information and communication technology.

CLAUSE 8

THAT, clause 8 of the Bill be amended—

- (a) in paragraph (a) by—
 - (i) deleting the word “six” appearing in the proposed new subsection 1(a) and substituting therefor the word “three”; and
 - (ii) deleting the word “six” appearing in the proposed new subsection 1(b) and substituting therefor the word “three”.
- (b) by deleting paragraph (b)

CLAUSE 17

THAT, clause 17 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (c).

CLAUSE 19

THAT, clause 19 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting therefor the following new provision—

- (a) in paragraph (b) by deleting the words “destruction or alienation” and substituting therefor the word “disposal”

CLAUSE 20

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 20 and substituting therefor the following new clause—

“20. Section 27 (1) of the Anti-Counterfeit Act is amended by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting therefor the following new paragraph—

- (a) is ordered by a court to return, release or otherwise dispose of those goods as specified in the order:

Provided that in the case of counterfeit goods, such goods shall be disposed at the expense of the local manufacturer or importer, as the case may be, based on the environmental considerations and the capacity of the country to dispose the goods or shall be reshipped;”

- (a) by deleting paragraph (a); and
- (b) in paragraph (b) by deleting the expression “subsection (4)” and substituting therefor the expression “subsection (14)”.

 - (c) deleting the word “Agency” wherever it appears and substituting therefor the word “Authority”

CLAUSE 23

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 23 and substituting therefor the following new clause—

“23. Section 35 of the Anti-Counterfeit Act is amended by deleting subsection (2) and substituting therefor the following new subsection—

- (2) A person convicted of an offence under section 24, 31, and 32 (h)(i), (j), (k), (l), (m) and (n), shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years, or a fine not exceeding two million shillings, or both.

CLAUSE 24

THAT, the Bill be amended in clause 24 by deleting the word “seven” appearing in paragraph (b) and substituting therefor the word “five”.

“third beneficiary” means a person or entity, other than the employer or employee, for whose benefit the services of an employee are provided pursuant to a business process outsourcing arrangement;

THAT, clause 12(c) of the Bill be amended by deleting the proposed definition of employer and substituting therefor the following new definition—

LIMITATION OF DEBATE

The House resolved on Wednesday, February 11, 2026 as follows—

Limitation of Debate on Motions

- II. THAT**, each speech in a debate on any **Motion, including a Special motion** shall be limited as follows: A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

Limitation of Debate on Other Committee Reports

- III. THAT**, each speech in a debate on **Other Committee Reports**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House for which limitation of time has not been specified, be limited as follows:- A maximum of two and a half hours, with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover in moving and five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, **including** the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Committee Report is not moved by the Chairperson of the relevant Committee), and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and further that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.

Limitation of Debate on Audit Committee Reports

- IV. THAT**, each speech in debate on **Reports of Audit Committees** be limited as follows:- A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.

Limitation of Debate on Bills sponsored by Parties or Committees

- V. THAT**, each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
